TEN-MINUTE CABBAGA

Chop a caubage as fine is for salad. Have ready a kettle of boiling water. Salt the water and put the cabbager in. Let the water boil exactly ten minutes, and then drain it sous. Season the cabbage with pepper, salt and butter.

DUTCH APPLE PIE.

Dutch apple pie is much appre ciated by children. Peel core and slive sufficient apples to fill the pie-dish; now strew a good handful of well-washed currants in between about 2oz., of citron peel cut small, the grated rind of half a lemon, and moist sugar to sweeten; add a little water, and cover with a good light crust in the usual way. Bake in a fairly hot oven about three-quarters of an hour. Serve hot, and sift caster sugar before sending table.

APPLE BIRD'S NEST.

Peel juicy, tart apples and slice very thin until you have enough to fill a quart xeasure. Put them in a buttered shallow baking dish or pan and pour water. Make a stiff bat er with a pint of sour milk, a pinch of salt, a heaping teaspoonful of butter and flour enough to make a stiff batter. Last of all, put in a teaspoonful of soda dissolved the apples and bake half an hour with cream and sugar.

Zeppelin vs. Aeroplance

The most remarkable thing about the Zeppelins is not how much they have succeeded in doing, but how little they have accomplished in the two months of use of air craft, they have proved very ineffective so far as we are allowed to slower than the aeroplanes, that they are easily attacked and destroyed if they dare linger over the enemy's lines. done anything like what was expected of them, the aeroplanes have revolution ed military work. It mus take days, for instance, for the German army to move a large number of men from its centre to its right or left wing with the intent of delivering at that point a crushing blow. Were such a movement made without the knowledge of the French general, it would almost certainly be successful, for it would take the French general an equally long time to move his forces to meet it, and he would not be able to put them in motion until he had discovered the enemy's move by the force of the blow delivered. Then it would be too late. By the aid of the aeroplane, numbers have become more important in war than strategy.
