**No Compromise on Home
Rule in Sight**

London, June 9.—Prospects of a com-
promise on the Home Rule issue are
growing less promising, as it is asserted
now that the Unionists will refuse to
recommence "conversations" unless the
amending bill offers Ulster complete ex-
clusion for an unlimited time.
(Montreal Herald Special.)

London, June 9.—The Government
has long been perturbed by the growth
of the Irish National Volunteers and
Mr. Redmond's endorsement of the
movement has increased their anxiety.
It is obviously impossible to prevent the
Nationalists organizing in view of the
tolerance displayed towards the Ulster
Volunteers, although both admittedly
are grossly illegal. The fact that the
impulsive Mr. Joseph Devlin, M. P.,
"bosses," the former is not a piece fact-
or.

Ulster advices indicate a real danger
of collisions there. Unionist newspap-
ers, while recognizing the danger, uti-
lize it for party purposes, thus the Pall
Mall Gazette says:

"After spending two years deriding
and abusing the Ulster Volunteers the
Nationalist party feels constrained to
make an imitation army. If the safety
of Ulster alone were concerned, we
would not be greatly disturbed if a ring
were drawn around the two sets of com-
batants and the issue left to their de-
cision. The exclusion of the northern
province would in that case be freed of
all anxiety."

This line of argument follows Sir
Edward Carson's speech on Monday ur-
ging the Ulstermen to be ready for an
emergency might come at an moment
and above all that they must not allow
anybody to take their arms away.

The Globe (Unionist) regards the
situation as intolerable and says:

"As the first result of a professional
policy of appeasement in Ireland we
see the country already divided into
two armed camps, its manhood dedicat-
ing its best energies to drilling and or-
ganizing for civil war. The Govern-
ment, not having dared to interfere
with the Ulster Volunteers has made it
impossible to interfere with the Nation-
al Volunteers. This is not government
—it is negotiation of government."

**Liberals to Grant Woman
Suffrage**

London, June 11.—Some signifi-
cant indications are visible of a
possible change of policy on the
part of the government with re-
gard to the suffragette question.
David Lloyd-George, addressing a
meeting of the Women's Liberal
Federation recently, declared that
only the militant campaign stood
in the way of women speedily get-
ting votes. According to the in-
spired statement in the Liberal pa-
pers this morning, Home Secretary
McKenna will make a state-
ment on the government's views,
but will suggest no new legisla-
tion on the subject. According to the
police view, not more than about
30 women are actually engaged in
incendiarism and destruction of
property. Editorials appear in
the Liberal papers this morning
urging it as an injustice that a
long decayed reform should be re-
fused to a large body of women in-
nocent of crime, because a few ob-
stinate women, persist in the pol-
icy of militancy.
