Buttermilk Pie. - This is almost unequalled for a sweet dish. Take one and a half cupfuls of buttermilk, one heaping cupful of sugar, oue cupful of chopped raisins, one tablespoonful of strong vinegar, two well beaten eggs, one and a half teaspoonful of flour or cornflour, half a teaspoonful each cf cinnamon and cloves, and a little nut. meg. Bake in two crusts, which should be rich and flaky. This quantity is sufficent for two

Sour Cream Mayonnaise. - Heat one half cup of vinegar, add two level teaspoons of salt, one level teaspoon of dry mustard, a saltspoon of pepper three level tablespoons of sugar, one tablespoon of butter and two beaten eggs. Cook in a double boiler until creamy, then add a cup of cream that has barely turned sour, and beat until the whole dressing is light. Chill and

Sour Cream Icing. - Whites of two eggs, one cup sugar, che-half pint sour cream, one-quarter pound shelled almonds, one teaspoon gelatin. Cover sugar with water and boil it until it "ropes," then pour it slowly over the well beaten whites of two eggs, beating constantly. Stir in the sour cream past their line of frontier fortwhich should be just clabbered, not resses to a point 20 miles behind old. Add a heaping teaspoon of gelatin dissolved in hot water and set away to thicken. When cool mix in the almonds. blanched and run through the chopper. This makes a most delicate filling for angel food.

CUCUMBER SAUCE.

Pare and cut cucumbers into fine dice till you have a cup of the vegetable, add one teaspoon each of salt, minced of viregar and lemon juice Drain in a colander for half an hour, set on the ice. Just before serving add one cup of stiffly whipped cream.

#### NASTURTIUMS.

If you had "good luck" with your nasturtiums, you should have quite a lot of fine blossoms, and these should give you a lot of nice seed pods. These will furnish a nice relish for the table. Gather the seed pods before they become in the least hardened else they will be tasteless. Pick the green seed vessels, cut off the dried blossoms which adhere to them, and drop them into a bottle of good cider vinegar. They will soon be sour and spicy and ready for the table. They will probably not stay a green color. Prepared this way, they are a fine subscitute for capers. You do not need to seal them air-tight as they will keep as long as the vinegar retains its strength.

No information is available as to whether the Germans now intend to devote themselves to the task of reducing Antwerp, or to an endeavor to force their way southward into France. It seems however, that the determination is to attack the Bolgian army of some 150,000 men who are still in or around Antwerp. The Germans already are advancing in the diection of Ghent. They have occupied Alest, fifteen miles northwest of Brussels, and Wetteren, eight miles southeast of Glent, and apparently intend to overrun the whole of northern Belgium to the eea. Cavalry patrols have been seen as far as Malines, fourteen miles southeast of Antwerp, and it may be expected before long to bear that the Germans have occupies Gheat and Bruges, and possibly even O tand.
