HOUSEHOLD

SPANISH EGGS. Boil a quarter of a pound of rice in salted water, add a tablespoonful of butter, a tablespoonful of grated cheese, and a tablespoonful of tomato pulp (no seeds). Break several eggs into a saucer, and slide them gently into boiling water to which has been added a little vinegar. When cooked so the yolks will not break arrange them over the rice spread on a hot platter.

IRISH EGGS. On delicately broiled slices of bacon poached eggs are placed and are covered with a rich cream sauce. Garnish with toast sippets.

JAPANESE EGGS. Boil six eggs hard. After removing the shells, cut the eggs in halves, lengthwise; take out the yolks and mash them. Add one teaspoonful of melted butter, three sardines rubbed to a paste, a dash of red pepper and half a teaspoonful of salt. Mix thoroughly, form the mixture into balls, and fill the space in each half egg with it. Have ready one cupful of carefully boiled rice, make a mound of it in the middle of the platter, press the eggs down into the rice, and stand the platter over hot water while you rub together two rounding teaspoons of butter and two of flour. To the butter and flour add half a pint of stock and half a pint of milk. Put this sauce over the fire and stir it until it boils; add one level teaspoonful of salt and a dash of red pepper. Strain this sauce over the eggs and rice, dust with chopped parsley and serve very hot.

A NEW OMELET. To make a tasty omelet cook two or three slices of bacon crisp and remove the meat. Fry in the bacon fat a slice of onion until it is golden brown and remove it. Turn in several lightly beaten eggs mixed with a little tomato pulp that has been drained from the liquor, the fried onion and bacon slices chopped fine, season with paprika, and cook like an ordinary omelet.

CUPPED EGGS. Put a piece of butter the size of a filbert in a small cup, also a pinch of salt and pepper. Break in an egg, do not stir. Set the cups in a pan of boiling water. When the yolks are set they are done.

British Consul Release of
