SAVORY POTATOES.

About six or eight potatoes, two small onions, one table spoon ful of finely chopped parsley. one heaping teaspoonful of butter, half a teaspoonful of salt, quarter teaspoonful of white pepper, half a cupful of milk. half a cupful of water, three heaping tablespoonfuls of grated cheese. Put the butter into the bottom of a saucepan. Pare the potatoes very thinly; chop the onions and parsley Mix the salt and pepper together on a saucer and have it beside you. Now cut the potatoes into slices (not shaving, remember), and put a layer in the saucepan. Sprinkle in a little seasoning, then onion and parsley and begin again with the potatoes. When all are used pour in the half cupful of water. Put the lid on close, and let it cook very gently for twenty minutes. If cooked fast the potatoes break up and the dish is spoiled. The potatoes should rather be steamed than anything else. Now pour in the milk and allow it to cook for another quarter of an hour. Then lift the potatoes carefully on a flat dish, strew over them the grated cheese, and brown in front of the fire or in the oven.

RHUBARB JELLY.

Small bunch rhubarb peeled and cut, put in saucepan with 4 oz. castor sugar or to taste, the finely cut rind of a lemon and half a pint of water. Simmer until tender, and rub through a fine sieve. Dissolve ? oz of leaf gelatine in 2 tablespoons of water and strain in with rhu. barb. Stir well; strain into a melted mould, and put in cold place to set.

BAKED RHUBARB.

Peel and cut in two inch dish, with sugar, a lowing pound to pound. Heap the dish with livered four attacks each, one of which in moderately quick oven and bake thirty minutes, or until yours, all of which resulted in com perfectly tender and surrounded plete failure, the enemy suffered heavy by rich syrup. Prepare as for pie; cover bot tom of baking dish with bread crumbs which have been stirred in a pan with melted' butter; add a layer of rhubarb, sprinkle with sigar; then another layer of buttered bread crumbs, and repeat until dish is full; cover and steam or bake, for balf an hour. Remove cover and brown. Eat hot with sweet sauce.

RHUBARB TART.

Peel and cut in inch pieces, stew with very little water, sweeten while hot, but do not cook the sugar with it. Have ready freshly baked shells, fill and serve. Top with a meringue or let cool and top with whip
