SAVORY POTATOES.

About six or eight potatoes, two small onions, one tablespoonful of finely chopped parsley, one heaping teaspoonful of butter, half a teaspoonful of salt, quarter teaspoonful of white pepper, half a cupful of milk, half a cupful of water, three heaping tablespoonfuls of grated cheese. Put the butter into the bottom of a saucepan. Pare the potatoes very thinly; chop the onions and parsley. Mix the salt and pepper together on a saucer and have it beside you. Now cut the potatoes into slices (not shaving, remember), and put a layer in the saucepan. Sprinkle in a little seasoning, then onion and parsley and begin again with the potatoes. When all are used pour in the half cupful of water. Put the lid on close, and let it cook very gently for twenty minutes. If cooked fast the potatoes break up and the dish is spoiled. The potatoes should rather be steamed than anything else. Now pour in the milk and allow it to cook for another quarter of an hour. Then lift the potatoes carefully on a flat dish, strew over them the grated cheese, and brown in front of the fire or in the oven.

RHUBARB JELLY.

Small bunch rhubarb peeled and cut, put in saucepan with 4 oz. castor sugar or to taste, the finely cut rind of a lemon and half a pint of water. Simmer until tender, and rub through a fine sieve. Dissolve 1/2 oz of leaf gelatine in 2 tablespoons of water and strain in with rhubarb. Stir well; strain into a melted mould, and put in cold place to set.

BAKED RHUBARB.

Peel and cut in two inch lengths. Lay in fireproof baking dish, with sugar, a lowing pound to pound. Heap the dish with rhubarb, as it shrinks. Set dish in moderately quick oven and bake thirty minutes, or until perfectly tender and surrounded by rich syrup. If oven is too hot, cover, as it must not brown.

Serve cold in glass dish, or line dish with macaroons or sponge cake, fill in with rhubarb and top with whipped cream.

RHUBARB PUDDING.

Prepare as for pie; cover bottom of baking dish with bread crumbs which have been stirred in a pan with melted butter; add a layer of rhubarb, sprinkle with sugar; then another layer of buttered bread crumbs, and repeat until dish is full; cover and steam or bake, for half an hour. Remove cover and brown. Eat hot with sweet sauce.

RHUBARB TART.

Peel and cut in inch pieces, stew with very little water, sweeten while hot, but do not cook the sugar with it. Have ready freshly baked shells, fill and serve. Top with a meringue or let cool and top with whipped cream.

PARIS, May 22.—(2.40 p. m.)—The French war office this afternoon gave out a report on the progress of the hostilities which reads as follows:

"It was a night of considerable activity between the sea and Arras, in Belgium. Following a violent bombardment, a German attacking column endeavored to gain a footing on the highway between Langemarck and Ypres. It was definitely checked.

"The Germans delivered two attacks yesterday to north of Aisain. In each case they were repulsed.

"To the north of Neuville, they delivered four attacks each, one of which was checked, by the fire of our artillery.

"In these various aggressive endeavours, all of which resulted in complete failure, the enemy suffered heavy losses.

"Nothing has been reported from the remainder of the front."

Accept Recruits Up To Age Of Forty Now

London, May 19.—An official announcement by the British War Office in connection with the appeal by Lord Kitchener, Secretary of War, for more men for the army, states it has been decided that recruits enlisting into the regular army for the duration of the war shall be accepted up to the age of forty years and that the minimum standard height for such recruits shall be five feet two inches for the infantry. This decision applies also to enlistments into the Territorial force.
