### Mrs. Margaret Malaney

At eleven o'clock on Sunday evening, Mrs. Margaret Malaney passed away to enjoy the beatific vision for all eternity. During a long life of 74 years she enjoyed exceptionally good health and her last illness of twelve days was practically her only illness. Her husband died five years ago. Her six children, all of Woodstock, were with her when she passed away. They are John P., William and George Malaney, Mrs. Octave Lavoie, Misses Mary and Margaret Malaney. The only surviving member of a large family is Mrs. Kate Campbell, a sister who resides in Bangor, Maine. She was born in Loughrae County Galway, Ireland, in 1841, coming to Woodstock when 14 years of age and with the exception of a few years has lived here all her life. She was a practical Catholic in religion and the uniform and feeling testimony of her family, friends and neighbors justifies the statement that she was one of those women who do credit to their sex and honor to the world. There was no duty in life that she did not willingly and most cheerfully perform. Living not for herself but for others, she achieved that greatest glory of having her children and friends call her blessed. The interment took place in the Catholic cemetery on Tuesday afternoon, after a short service at St. Gertrude's church, conducted by Rev. F. J. McMurray. The pall bearers were John P. and Wm. Malaney, Octave Lavoie and Frederick Buck. Director Bailey was in charge of the funeral, which was largely attended by many neighbors and friends.
