Recipe for Curing Meat

I submit our meat curing for
mula, says L. C. H. in the Bre-
ders' Gazette: 10 quarts of salt
5 pounds of brown sugar, 1 te-
spoonful of red pepper and 1 te-
aspoonful of black pepper. When
the pork has cooled rub this in
thoroughly, especially around the
bone. Place the meat in a box
or barrel for four weeks; then
dip it in boiling water for one
half minute or until the fat
shows a clear white; dry at once.
When cool rub it with equal
parts of black pepper and pow-
dered borax. The meat is now
ready to smoke. We use green
hickory and sassafras. The rub-
bing with the pepper and borax
just before smoking is to pre-
vent flies and ham beetles from
infesting it. We have kept for
two years meat cured in this
way, and had no trouble from
either flies or beetles; nor was
the meat strong. In fact, we
put this cure against any pack-
ing house product. We do not
wrap our meat in either paper
or burlap. It is not necessary as
a means of protection. Some
use liquid smoke, but I fear that
in painting the meat with the
smoke the borax and pepper may
be more or less rubbed off, and
thus the pork would be exposed
to the fly.

Liver and Rice

'Perhaps you think the com-
bination of liver and rice doesn't
sound appetizing,' suggested
Wilhemina Ryberg, Swedish
teener of Domestic Economy
'But try it and be convinced.
I've known many a Canadian
palate to be delighted by the
dish, and, in addition, it's spe-
cially pleasing to the pocket-
book, for it is one of the most
economical dishes I know.

'For a family of four or five,
take one cup of rice, wash and
drop slowly into boiling salted
water, stirring thoroughly. When
the rice is done, drain through a
colander. Meanwhile prepare
the liver. The Swedish people
prefer pig's liver. In fact, they
insist that any other spoils the
dish. But my experience is that

calves' liver is nearly as satis-
factory.

'Boil about one pound of the
liver in salted water for twenty
minutes. Then put through a
grinder. Season with pepper
and mix very thoroughly with
the rice.

Place in a mold or bowl. A
plate weighted with a flat iron
should be put on top of the rice
and liver to compress it into a
cake while it cools. When it is
hard remove from the mold and
slice in pieces half an inch thick.
These slices are fried brown in
butter. Serve at once

'This dish is also very tasty
served in cold slices, unfried.

Celery Relish.

Chop two hearts of celery fine
and add a sweet green pepper,
washed and chopped fine, with-
out the seeds, a pimento chop-
ped fine, some paprika celery
salt and a little salt, Barela
cover with mild cider vinegar
and let it stand for five or six
hours. This same mixture with-
out vinegar may be mixed with
mayonnaise and served on let-
tuce or salad.

Crackers a la Creme.

Allow two butter crackers to
each person. Split them and
spread with butter, sprinkle on a
little salt, pepper and mustard
and then cover with grated
cheese. Put them in a buttered
pudding dish, cover with milk
and, if convenient, let them
stand half an hour, then bak
about the same time, or until
brown.

Owing to the fact that Sweden has
enormous peat deposits, many at-
tempts have been made during the
last few years to invent and develop
devices for utilizing these deposits.
Experiments have been made in stok-
ing stationary engines, and the re-
