POTTED MEAT.

Potted meat is nourishing and appetizing, and provides an excellent way of disposing of remnants of cooked meat that are left over, without, in every case, re-cooking it. Meat prepared in this way has the recommendation, too, of keeping longer in the hot weather than it would otherwise. The potting is done by pounding the flesh to a pulp in a mortar, after removing all gristle, skin, fat, and sinew, mixing it with salt and spices, pressing it into a jar, and covering it with a thick coat of melted butter or lard to exclude the air. As a pestle and mortar do not form part of the equipment of most kitchens, a stone jar or any suitable bowl, and the flat end of a rolling pin, will do the work equally well though it may not be finished so quickly. The remains of any tender roasted or boiled beef or other meat can be used for potting. The gravy must be drained thoroughly from the meat or the latter will not keep. Cut the meat into small pieces and pound it well, with a little butter, add cayenne and mace according to the quantity of meat, first reducing the mace to the finest powder. When thoroughly mixed put in to glass or earthenware pot, pressing in firmly and, when cold pour over it a coating of melted lard. To put up the remains of a boiled ham in this way take a quarter of a pound of fat ham and a quarter of a pound of lean a quarter of a salt-spoon of cayenne, a quarter of a nutmeg and a pinch of powdered mace. Pass the ham through a mincing machine or chop it finely; mix with it the cayenne, grated nutmeg, and mace. When the ingredients are thoroughly mixed press them into a buttered pie dish, put a piece of greased paper over the top, place the dish in the oven, and bake for about twenty-five minutes. Then press the meat into jars, cover the top with a layer of melted lard, and leave till cold.

BRAN AND OATMEAL.

Mix half a cup of bran with the same quantity of oatmeal, add half a level teaspoon salt, pour one pint of boiling water upon the mixture, stirring in the meantime, and cook slowly for two hours; or simmer ten minutes and place in fireless cooker over night.

NUTRITIOUS BRAN GEMS.

Cream together three quarters cup sugar and one level tablespoon shortening; add one egg, one level teaspoon salt, one pint of sour milk or buttermilk, two cups of bran, one cup white flour, and one and-a-half teaspoons baking soda dissolved in a quarter of a cup of hot water. Bake from thirty to thirty-five minutes in a rather quick oven.

BRAN GEMS WITH SWEET MILK.

Mix thoroughly half a pint of bran with the same quantity of white flour, and two level teaspoonsful of baking powder, add one level teaspoon salt; beat in two eggs, having the whites beaten separately, add one pint of milk, and half a cup of molasses. Bake in a moderate oven

TOMATO BISQUE.

One quart can tomatoes, three 2 inch sticks cinnamon, 1 pint water, 3 slices lemon, 2 teaspoons salt, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 1/2 tablespoons sugar, 3 tablespoons flour, 1 cup cream. Cook the tomato, sugar, cinnamon, lemon and salt together for 20 minutes. Put through a colander and bind with the butter and flour. Let boil five minutes, add the hot cream and serve at once. If preferred, bay leaf and onion may be used for seasoning in preference to the cinnamon and lemon. Condensed tomato may be used in this recipe, in which case use 1 1/2 cups condensed tomatoes and an additional 2 1/2 cups of water.

A CHEF'S SUGGESTIONS

Small pieces of chicken with the merest bit of its own liver pounded with some cream and a little coralline pepper make a delicious paste to spread on thin slices of brown bread.

Before attempting to seed raisins cover them with hot water and let them stand 15 minutes; then the seeds can be removed easily without any waste.

That a teaspoonful of curry powder added to the cream sauce in which macaroni is baked greatly improves the flavor.

Back to Ancient Times in Venice

Venice, via Paris, May 26. — The military authorities have given orders that no lights be displayed in Venice between sunset and sunrise that can be seen from above the city. This is a measure of protection against attack by aeroplane. The aspect of Venice at night has been changed by this order. The people of Venice are normally much afraid at night, but now they are staying up even later than usual. They enjoy the aspect of the city without light, and they are eagerly looking into the air for the sight of an Austrian aeroplane. Nobody seems to fear a visit from these machines.
