HOUSEHOLD

AN EASY SANDWICH
A quickly prepared sandwich
is made by pulping a banana and
adding enough lemon juice to
give it the requisite piquancy.
Spread on thin slices of brown
bread and serve at once.

POTATO SALAD (WARM)
Five potatoes, two tablespoons
butter, two tablespoons flour,
one cup water, two eggs, two
teaspoons sugar, one teaspoon
mustard, salt and pepper, one-
third cup vinegar. Melt the but-
ter, add the flour and cook until
bubbling; add the water, cook
until smooth, remove from the
fire, cool slightly and add the
well-beaten eggs, then the vine-
gar and seasonings. Return to
the fire and cook until smooth
and thick. Have ready sliced
potatoes slightly warm, pour the
warm dressing over them and
mix lightly. Garnish with hard-
cooked eggs.

OATMEAL GEMS
Take one cupful of cooked oat-
meal, one cupful of sweet milk,
two teaspoonfuls of sugar, one
beaten egg, one-half teaspoonful
of salt, one-half teaspoon of soda
and one teaspoonful of cream
of tartar (or one heaping
teaspoonful of baking powder in-
stead of the soda and the cream
of tartar), and just enough flour
to hold the mixture together.
Bake the dough in hot gem pans
in a quick oven.

BEEF STEAK AS IN GREECE
Equal parts of veal and beef
chopped fine must be well sea-
soned with pepper, salt, and any
other spices liked, and mixed
into flat cakes with cooked rice.
Then the cakes must be rather
quickly fried in butter or other
good fresh fat. When partly
cooked the cakes are well flour-
ed and put into a stewpan with
some good brown stock and al-
lowed to stew until cooked
through.

NUT ROAST
Mix together one-half a cupful
of chopped walnut meats and
two cupfuls of bread crumbs.
Pour over them a pint of boil-

ing water, and, after they are
well mixed, add a beaten egg,
one-half a teaspoonful of olive
oil or peanut oil and salt to taste.
Stir thoroughly and bake in cas-
serole dish or an ordinary bread
pan. A little grated cheese may
be sprinkled over the top. This
will serve five people.

Hindenburg For Western
Command

New York, Feb. 27—A special to
the London Daily Express and New
York Herald, from the Belgian fron-
tier, says:

The appearance of Field Marshal
Von Hindenburg in France and Flan-
ders, as commander-in-chief of the
German western armies, is being free-
ly predicted by both officers and men
among the Kaiser's forces. His suc-
cesses in the eastern frontier have
greatly impressed the Emperor, whose
disappointment at the failures of his
generals on the other front is great.

The Kaiser's discontent with his
army commanders in the western area
has been notorious. He praised Gen-
eral Von Kluck for the first dash to
waru Pa is, but afterward he soundly
rattled him for not outflanking the
British. He also criticized General
Von Herrigen's plan of attack during
the earlier operations along the Aisne.
There have also been several stormy
interviews between the Emperor and
the Bavarian Crown Prince.

Paris, Feb. 27—The Germans are
again bombarding Arras and Soissons,
as the result of French troops con-
centrations in those cities, according
to despatches received in Paris to-day.
The big German mortars have done
terrible havoc at Arras, and a great
part of the city is in ruins. Despite
rainy, foggy weather in West Flanders
artillery duelling is still in progress
there. A considerable amount of
French artillery has been placed at
the disposal of the Belgians, who are

shelling the Germans lines near Os-
tend, infantry fighting in the forest's
north of Verdun has cost the Germans
heavily, in the Bois Forges peasants
have been working for two days bury-
ing the dead, and still many bodies
remain upon the ground. Further to
the south, in the Meuse Valley, near
St. Mihiel, the French have repulsed
with heavy losses attempts of the Ger-
mans to retake some of the ground
they lost. There is a double in the
River Meuse at that point, forming a
letter "S." Ally, which has been men-
tioned in the recent official despatches,
lies at the eastern extremity of the
lower bend. The French occupy a
strong position on the eastern bank of
the stream and are throwing shells
across the river into the German lines
on the west bank. There has been no
decisive result during the past few days'
fighting in the Vosges and Upper
Alsace.
