Thousands Torn From Homes BY Soldiers

Paris, Aug. 3.-Poignant details u the deportation at an hour and a half's notice of 25,000 citizens from the French towns of Lille, Roubaix and Tourcoing by the Germans last Eastern are given in a French Yellow Book released for publication today.

"The measure caused the greatest anguish and despair among the popula tion of the notified district, while in some cases it led to madness. Many people become very ill.

"Parents especially suffered torture at secing their wives, daughters and children of both sexes over the age of 14 led away or packed into street cars promiscuously with bad characters of all sorts, male and female, not knowing what was to be their destination or after night during the ten days of Eas ter.

"The p otests of mayors and other of ficials were unheeded. A bishop who in tervened personally was told by a gen eral: 'You bshop, shut up and be off. At the beginning of the deportation some girls of the aristocracy were seiz ed, but they soon were released, as were also daughters of thrse in the houses where German officers were bil leted.

"At Roubaix the Prussian Guard re fused to participate in the raids and the work had to be done by the Sixty fourth Regiment from Verdun. Some soldiers engaged in the deportation were even seen to shed tears.

"A large proportion of the young wo men taken belonged to the servant class several of whom volunteered to go in the place of their employers' daughters. On the other hand, many young women of the better classes wanted to accom pany the servant girls of their family. When those deported were conveyed to the railway station and loaded into the cattle trucks, they kept crying: 'Vive stated, the American purchasers a France!' and singing the Marsetll | must furnish the Russian comaise."



Boches Love Loot

(London "Chronicle.") War Loot for War Loan is said to be the latest exhortation to the German people, and one wonders if as many French clocks have found their way to the Fatherland in the present war as went there in 1870.
