Show number of days. absent at rate given below; 24 hours required before showing one day, half days over this will count as one day; less than half day not to count. If absence is less than 24 hours, actual expenses may be claimed on second part back of form, but not travelling allow-.10 ance; over 24 hours travelling allowance is claimed, but not actual expenses for .10 board and lodging.
