Fine English Art

An incident of a London Red Cross sale was the purchase by Lady Wernher of a panel of English tapestry, probably woven at Soho in the early eighteenth century, for \$2,275, to give to the London Museum, and her purchase of a Toft ware dish, inscribed "Thomas Toft," for 600 guineas—after purchasing it once for 650 guineas and putting it in the sale again for the benefit of the Red Cross. This piece of ware Lady Wernher gave to the British Museum. Toft ware, which is very rare, was one of the peasant industries that fought a losing fight against imported German earthenware, and in character nothing resembling it was ever imported.
