An incident of a London Red Cross sale was the purchase by Lady Wernher of a panel of English tapestry, probably woven at Soho in the early eighteenth century, for \$2,275, to give to the London Museum, and her par. chase of a Toft ware dish, inscribed Thomas Toft," for 600 guineasafter purchasing it once for 650 gameas and putting it in the sale again for the benefit of the Red Cross. This piece of ware Lady Wernher tave to the British Museum. Toft ware, which is very rare, was one of the peasant industries that fought a losing fight against imported German earthouware, and in character nothing esembling it was ever imported.
