PUDDING.**

One pint milk, unsweetened grated chocolate enough to make it a good dark brown. With some makes of chocolate half a cake is needed, while with some a little more than quarter of a cake is enough. Heat the milk and chocolate together with a half cup of white sugar. Then add two beaten eggs with a little more milk in which two tablespoons of cornstarch have been stirred and a teaspoonful of vanilla. When cooked, remove from stove and stir in a piece of butter the size of a walnut. Serve cold with whipped cream; flavored with vanilla.

**MORE MOLASSES DOUGH  
NUTS**

One cup molasses, one cup sugar, two tablespoons melted lard, one-and-a-half cups sour milk, one-and-a-half teaspoons baking soda, one egg, half a teaspoon salt, nutmeg to taste, and flour enough to roll out.

Here is another: Two eggs, one cup molasses, one cup sugar, five tablespoons melted butter, a pinch of salt, one-and-a-half cups buttermilk, a little allspice and two heaping teaspoons baking soda, dissolved in water. Flour to make dough.

**CORN BREAD.**

Materials—Two eggs, 1 teaspoonful salt, 2 cupfuls milk, 3 tablespoonfuls sugar, 3 heaping tablespoonfuls flour, yellow corn meal to form a batter, 2 heaping teaspoonfuls baking powder.

Directions—Beat the eggs well, add the salt, milk and sugar, and beat in the our and baking powder with enough corn meal to form a soft batter; bake in shallow, well greased pans in a moderate oven about half an hour. The exact quantity of corn meal cannot be given—usually about 2 cups will be sufficient.

**POTATO SCONES.**

Materials—Three cupfuls flour, 1 teaspoonful salt, 3 teaspoonfuls baking powder, 3 med-

medium-sized boiled potatoes, 3 tablespoonfuls buttermilk to moisten.

Directions—Sift together the flour, salt and baking powder, rub in the butter, add the potatoes smoothly mashed, then mix to a light, soft dough with the milk. Divide into three portions, roll out thin into rounds, out each across so as to make four triangular cakes. Bake either on a griddle or in a hot oven.

**MAPLE SUGAR BISCUIT.**

Directions—Make up an ordinary biscuit dough; roll it out thin and sprinkle heavily with crushed or grated maple sugar. Double the dough together, so that the sugar is in the middle. Cut into squares, so as to avoid having fragments to roll out a second time. Brush with milk and bake as ordinary biscuit.

**Baralong Man Tells of  
Fight**

London, January. 11.—The "Daily Chronicle" publishes the story of a gunner who was a member of the "Baralong's" crew, concerning the attack on the "Nicosian" and the sinking of a German submarine.

"On August 19, at 2 p. m.," says the gunner, "we received a wireless message from the 'Nicosian' saying she was being chased

by a German submarine. We accordingly preceded full speed to her assistance. At 3 p. m. we sighted the 'Nicosian,' which was being shelled by the submarine while the crew was getting the lifeboats out.

"We got plenty of ammunition ready on the poop and at 3.30 p. m. the marines took cover behind the bulwarks on the port side of the after-deck with rifles. The gunners also took cover behind their guns. The excellent seamanship of our captain brought our ship up on the starboard of the 'Nicosian,' the submarine being on the port side, so that for a few minutes we were hidden from the submarine's view. During that short interval we cleared for action, trained our guns out-board, set the sights for 700 yards, and hoisted the white ensign.

"As soon as we appeared round the bows of the 'Nicosian' the submarine fired one shot at us, which went wide. The marines then opened with a well-aimed volley, which swept the decks of the submarine and seemed to demoralize her crew, for they immediately left their guns and rushed for the conning tower, several going overboard, but whether they were slain by rifle fire or whether they dived over from panic I cannot say.

"We then opened fire with our port and stern guns, but the first shot hit short. However, I should say it hit the submarine beneath the water line. The next shot hit the conning tower, which appeared to be split in half, sending two men flying into the air. The next and successive shots all hit the submarine, which gradually sank, everyone of her crew being either drowned or shot, and only a few

parts of bodies and a large quantity of oil remained on the surface.

"The action lasted four minutes and thirty seconds, during which time we fired thirty-seven rounds between the two guns. We then took aboard the crew of the 'Nicosian,' who numbered 107, not one of whom was injured or killed. Our casualties were nil.

"We were all absolutely disgusted at the cowardice displayed by the crew of the submarine, who were more heavily armed than ourselves.

"Not only were their two guns of heavier calibre than ours, but, in addition, they had several torpedo tubes whereas we could only get two guns to bear upon them. If they had stuck to their guns they would at least have stood a sporting chance, but apparently German submarines, although always ready to attack defenceless merchant ships and kill and maim their passengers and crews, have no stomach for fighting armed ships of His Majesty's navy, even when the odds are in their favor."

"It is my belief, and I venture to assert it," declared the lecturer, raising his voice, "that there isn't a man in this audience who has ever done anything to prevent the destruction of our vast forests."
