For Aiding Huns Detailed Story of Erzerum's Capture

PETROGRAD Feb 19. (Vis Lon don) - The first story, in detail of the capture of Erzerum' by the Russians. reached Petrograd semi officially to day It shows complete co operation of Russian troops over a wide area. which made usel-se resistance on the part of the Turks. Apparently the Turks restized the fall of Erzerum was was inevitable, and withdrew most of their forces before the final onalaught leaving the partiana or the widely se parated forts to their fate.
