Tombstones For Monkeys

Tucked away in one corner of Montevideo, Uruguay, is a small, carefully kept cemetery for receiving the deceased pets of wealthy families, who often pay somewhat lavish fees for a small plot of ground. While in some cases the graves are supplied merely with headstones, there are many of them which have substantial monuments. It is not infrequently the case that these plots are locked after almost as carefully as if they held the bodies of human beings. There are dogs and monkeys, parrots, cats, and various other animals, resting beneath tombstones, their names inscribed in granite or marble, and their graves adorned with flowers.

OUR WATER POWER

The Development of Late Years Has Shown Remarkable Increase

In the course of a comprehensive article on water powers in Canada, Engineering says that from an economic standpoint the rivers tributary to the Great Lakes are of far-reaching importance. Of those flowing into Lake Ontario, the Trent occupies easily the first place. This is one of the rivers whose hydraulic usefulness has suffered from deforestation, but the flow conditions have been materially improved by work undertaken by the Dominion Government, showing that the mischief is not irreparable. Now 75,000 horse-power is capable of more or less ease development by reason of the Trent Canal Works. Of this total, 45,000 is now actively used, of which the Electric Power Company absorb 33,000 horse-power. This company, with a 44,000-volt transmission line, 300 miles in length, supply power to a large territory, and has obtained complete control of the light and power business in the territory served by the transmission lines—a policy that is likely to find many imitators in the future. Most of the rivers that flow into Lake Erie, to the Grand River, lack natural control, owing to agricultural necessities, and can only be regarded as sources of intermittent power for purely local purposes. Lake Huron can claim some tributaries of greater industrial value, their total low-water

capacity being placed at 100,000 horse-power, of which 58,000 is at present developed. The more considerable of the developed sites are on the Spanish River, where the Canadian Copper Papper Company has 12,500 horse-power installed for the operation of its mines and smelters; and lower down the river, the Pulp and Paper Company utilizes 10,000 horse-power for the conduct of its business. There is evidence of very considerable extension in the near future.

FISH SCALES

In Days Gone by Were Most Valuable Part of Fish

Among unconsidered trifles may be included the scales of fish. Of value and utility to the owner during its sojourn in the vasty deep, the scales are ignored after capture as good for the manure heap. But it was not ever thus. In days gone by fish scales possessed a real value, notably those of roach, bleak, dace, and whitebait. Older writers tell us how the scales of these fishes were collected and used in the manufacture of necklaces, ear-rings, and such-like ornaments. London fishermen used to catch the fish, take off the scales, and throw the body back into the river. A pigment was obtained by treating the scales in a certain fashion, white-bait being the most popular fish used for the purpose. So great, formerly, was the demand at times that the price of a quart of fish-scales varied from one to five guineas. This treatment of fish-scales for making small personal adornments is attributed to the French. A Parisian artist one winter, it is said, used thirty hamperfuls of bleak scales in the course of manufacture. To-day, however, the industry is practically extinct.

London, March 30.—Five vessels are reported to have been sunk during the past 24 hours—three British steamers, the Diadem, Kilbride and Lavinia Westcott; the Dutch steamer Duiveland, and the small Russian schooner Otomar.
