Find Tons of Copper In Oil Ship's Tanks

New York, July 15 .- The Norregian oil tank steamer Conrad Mohr, Captain Peter Einerson in command, was in the Narrows and heading three-quarters full speed for Sandy Hook and the open sea late Friday afternoon, when a deetroyer of the United States Alantic Fleet, which had been ordered to overhaul the steamer, speeded down the bay and into the Narrows and signalled the Norwegian to hait. The tanker slowly came to a stop and several customs inspectors were transferred from the destroyer to the ship. An inspection followed and, nothing excep oil being discovered, the commander of the destroyer ordered the Conrad Mohr back to Bayonne for a more rigid inspection. The recond inspection, in which grappling hooks played a part, resulted in the discovery of more than 10,000 feet of copper cable wire, we'ghing many tons, submerged in the oil tanks, and with this discovery the Federal authorities now believe they have at last solved a problem which has long perplexed the Secret Service, namely, the way in which Germany has been able to replenish her depleted stock of metals useful for war.

Escaped Huns by Drugging Guards

New York, July 16-Held a prisoner three years in a German detention camp at Luxemburg, despite his protests that he was an American citizen, Dr. A. M. Mare ecitor of L'Arenir of San Francisco, who arrived here today on a Spanish steamship, said he escaped to Holland after plying his captors with drugs while they were in toxicated, and stealing an officer's uniform. A United States consul in Holland told him to say nothing until he reached this country, Dr. Mars declared, and through the officer's aid he reached Spain.

Dr. Mars said the treatment accorded French and English prisoners is indescribable. The German officers, he said, encourage the men in such abuses.

Dr. Mare, who was born in Paris, 18 a naturalized American citizen. He was arrested by German authorities three years ago, while he was in that country settling an estate. He said the German officers refused to communi cate with Ambassador Gerard.

Prisoners detained in the camp suffered greatly from lack of pro. per food, Dr. Mare raid and the treatment they received from their captors was harsh in the extreme. A substance which the Germans called "homlen," made of potato peelings, grass and flour, and which the physician declared was not even tit food for animale, was served to the prisoners, he assert-

Dr. Mare said he was treated well by the Germane when they learned he was a physician, and he was put in charge of the health of the camp by Gen. Von Gotch. His meals, he said, were better than those served to the German officere,

About 3,000 persons were in the camp, the physician said, and when he assumed his medical dutjee he found a large number of the prisoners were suffering from a dysentry caused by improperly cooked bread. About 1,500 prisoners

who were willing to work were ent to manufacturing plants and farms in the vicinity.

Tae English prisoners, Dr. Mare declared, refused to work and the severity of their treatment was increased. The French prisoners far ed better. Un one occasion when he complained to German officers because a German soldier spat in the food served to English prisonere, he was informed, he asserted, that it was none of his affair.

After his escape, Dr. Mars reach ed the Datch border with money given to him by Bavarian monke, All his own money, about \$5,000, had been taken from him by the Germans when he was arrested.

Palestine to be Real Paradise

New York, July 16-A Jewish nation with modern cities, a free government and a population of two million will be established in Palestine after the war, in the opinion of Nathan Strause, philan thropiet.

He looks for a marked exodus of Jews from the United States and other countries, back to their fatherland. Religious Jewe, he believes, will not hestitate to give up their wealth and property in America and return to Palestine to fultill the Biblical prophecy. Strauss also expects thousands of Christians to go there.

"We will establish a Government along whatever lines the Allies suggest," declared Stranss. There is no selfsbnees about it. The Bible says we will have our own country back and the Allies are winring it back. They must decide what is best."

He indicated, however, that a republican form of government under a protectorate of the Powers would be best. Asked whether the country would be modernized, as Manila has beer, he said:

"Given half a chance we will make it the Paradise of the earth. It will be up-to-date in every particular. The Palestine soil as better than that of California-I'm satisfied of that through my own experiments. The Jewish nation will be self-supporting. I aen't think we shall establish great industries and complete in the world trade because of the country will be more of a religious community than a commercial one. Palestine will support two million people, and it only has 600,000 now. Educationally and religionsly it wili be the promised land of the whole world."


