### HOUSEHOLD

CANNING STRING BEANS.

Inquiries are asking for a recipe for canning string beans with cream of tartar. We have printed this several times, and readers who have tried it always pieces. Add water enough to cover, and to each quart of beans tartar. Boil 20 minutes and put in fruit cans. When using them cold water, and cook in the usual way, adding one teaspoonful baking soda to each quart of beans .- Rural New Yorker.

#### TO COOK PEAS

WITH LEAST TROUBLE

Save the time it takes to shell green peas by cooking them the following way: Carefully wash the unshelled peas, discarding all the bad ones. Put the unshelled peas into the kettle with sufficient hot water to boil them, says American Agriculturist. When they are cooked the pods will break and rise to the surface and can easily be skimmed off, while the peas stay at the bottom. Peas cooked this way have a much better flavor.

# OF PRESERVING

Pears, apples and other fruits are reduced to a paste by jammirg, which is then pressed into cakes, and gently dried. When required for use it is only necessary to pour four times their weight of boiling water over them and allow them to soak for twenty minutes and then add sugar to suit the taste. The fine flavor of the fruit is said to be retained to perfection. The keeping qualities are excellent No paring of coring is required

### CHEESE AND RICE BATTER

Make a batter of one cupful of flour, one egg well beaten and one half cupful of milk. Beat it thoroughly and set it aside for at least half an hour. Then add one half cupful of boiled rice, one half cupful of milk, one half teaspoonful of baking powder, four tablespoonfuls of grated cheese, one half teaspoonful of salt and a dash of Cayenne pepper. Mix well, put into a buttered baking dish and bake in a hot oven twenty to thirty minutes. This must not stand after it is taken from the oven.

#### CHOCOLATE RICE PUD-DING

Two cupfuls of rice, four eggs, wo-thirds cupful sugar, one teaspoonful vanilla, three cupfuls milk, one-balf teaspoonful salt,

one square chocolate. Grate the chocolate and melt in a double boiler; add to the milk, salt, and sugar; then stir in the cooked rice. Add the beaten yolks and half of the Flavor with beaten whites. vanilla, pour into a pudding-dish the custard is set. Make a meringue with the remaining whites of eggs and a little sugar, and out unnecessarily lowering the supplies

spread over the top of the pudding; then return to the oven until e delicate brown on top.

These blows are really aids to the Allies, as they weaken German strength. Failure to secure a victory in the West while Russia is striking telling blows in the East increase Austro-Hungarian anxiety for peace and German dissatis

ment of Agriculture has requested mill ers throughout Canada to put on the market the cracked and shrunken wheat removed from grain before it is milled.

In addition to small and broken wheat these cleanings consist chiefly of the seeds of wild buckwheat, a near relat ive of the cultivated buckwheat. The Poultry Division of the Central Experi mental Farm has used wild buck wheat in feeding experiments and reports it to be a highly satisfactory poultry feed and has ordered two cars of buckwheat screening for the Central and Branch Experimental Farms from the Canadian Government Elevators at Fort William. Fowls used to good grain do not take to it at first but when they become ac customed to it they est it readily and do well on it.

The mill cleanings from local flour mills also contain traces of many other weed seeds, including several kinds of mustards. These, however, would not as a rule amount to more than two or three per cent of the cleanings in the case of the standard grades of Western wheat. This material is specially recom mended for backyard, suburban and professional poultrymen. On farms the cleanings from yards and poultry houses where it had been fed would have to be disposed of so as not to disseminate noxious weeds in grain fields.
