### German Launch Heavy Attacks

London, Sept. 22.—Troops of Crown Prince Rupprecht of Bavaria continued last night to launch heavy counter attacks against the new British lines east of Ypres on the Belgian front. Field Marshal Haig in his report to-day to the war office announces. The Germans used considerable forces in their attacks without gaining any result except to heavily increase their losses.

### Drops Bombs on German Points

LONDON, Sept. 29.—British aviators dropped seven tons of explosives in attacks Thursday night on German military establishments in Belgium. The following is the statement given out to-day by the admiralty:

"On the night of Sept. 27-28 there were bombing raids by naval aircraft on the following objectives. The lock gates at Zeebrugge, the St. Denis West rem airdrome, the Goetrode airdrome, the Houttave airdrome.

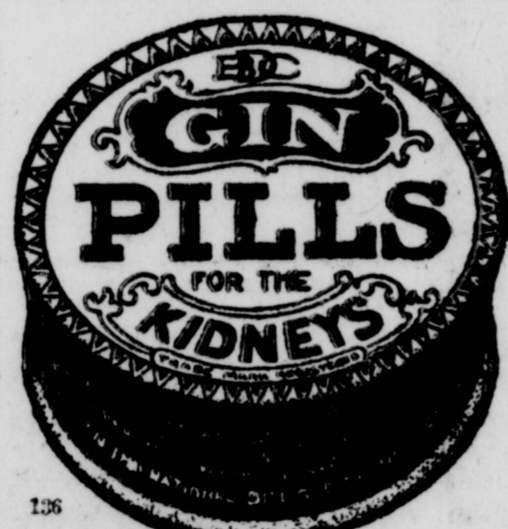
"The bomb dropping at Zeebrugge appeared to be good, while at Houttave bombs fell among hangars and huts on the southwest side of the airdrome. Seven tons of explosives were dropped. All the machines returned."

Reporting aviation battles on the western front, the war office says:

"On Thursday a heavy ground mist again hindered aerial work, but our air planes continued to co operate with the artillery. Many hostile aerists were reconnoitered and photographed during the day. Bombs were dropped by our airmen on the enemy's airdrome of Carniere, St. Denis Westem, and Goetrode, on billets at Moorslede and other targets. At night a total of six and three-quarters tons of bombs were dropped on the following objectives: Goetrode airdrome, with good results; on

the enemy's railway stations at Rumbeke, Menin, Weveghem, and Ledeghem, and various hostile billets and an ammunition dump.

"In the course of these raids the German troops and transports were successfully attacked by machine gun fire from our aircraft flying at a low altitude. In the air fighting several German machines were downed and three others were driven down out of control. One was shot down by our infantry fire. One of our machines is missing."
