HOUSEHOLD

OLD-FASHIONED MUFFINS

One cup flour, 1 cup bran, 1
cup cornmeal, 1 beaten egg,
1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup short-
ening, salt, 1 teaspoon soda dis-
solved in 1 1/2 cups sour milk. Mix
well, and bake in muffin tins in
a fairly quick oven.

OAT CAKE

A bowlful of oatmeal, pinch of
salt, saltspoon each of sugar and
baking-soda, and butter size of
an egg. Rub butter well into
meat, add other ingredients, wet
with warm water to form a soft
dough, and work into a round
cake to keep the edges from
breaking. Spread plenty of meal
under it, and roll thin. Cook one
side on griddle then in slow oven.
When hardened cut in three-corn-
ered pieces before baking.

HEALTH BISCUITS

Two cups bran, 1 cup flour,
1/2 cup brown sugar, 1-2 teaspoon
salt, 1 1-2 teaspoons lard or but-
ter, 1-2 cup sour milk, 1 tea-
spoon salt, and 1-3 cup molasses.
Drop from spoon on buttered
pan, and bake in a slow oven.

BROWN BREAD

Two cups flour, 2 cups bran,
salt, 1 tablespoon brown sugar,
1 teaspoon soda, sour milk to
knead nicely. Pack in greased
tin, let rise 1-2 hour, then bake
slowly in the oven 3-4 or 1 hour,
with a tin or greased paper over it

VEGETABLE SALAD.

Six good-sized potatoes boiled
and diced; 3-4 cup of finely chop-
ped cabbage; 3 tablespoonfuls of
chopped pickles; 2 chopped oni-
ons, 2 chopped apples, 2 or 3
hard boiled eggs chopped fine,
butter size of an egg, chop all
separately, then mix thoroughly
with a fork. Pour over it a salad
dressing.

FRIED TOMATOES.

Select firm ripe tomatoes, wash
and cut them in thick slices with-
out paring them. Dust with pep-
per and salt and fry in hot butter.
When done, drain, and serve on
hot buttered toast, with or with-
out a dab of drawn butter sauce,
and garnished with parsley.

Canning String Beans

Inquirers are asking for a re-
ceipt for canning string beans
with cream of tartar. We have
printed this several times, and
readers who have tried it always
say that it is particularly good:
Wash and cut the beans in inch
pieces. Add water enough to
cover, and to each quart of beans
add one teaspoonful of cream of
tartar. Boil 20 min. and put in
fruit cans. When using them
pour off the water; rinse well in
cold water, and cook in the us-
ual way, adding one teaspoonful
baking soda to each quart of
beans.—Rural New Yorker.

Here is a remedy for cabbage

Sprinkle dry wheat flour over
the heart of the cabbage early in
