\$150,000,000 51% Gold Bonds

Bearing interest from December 1st 1917, and offered in three majorities, the choice of which is optional with the subscriber, as follows:

This Loan is authorized under Act of the Parliament of Canada, and both principal and interest are a charge apon the Consolidated Revenue Fund. The amount of this issue is \$150,000,000, exclusive of the amount (if any) haid by the surrender of bonds of previous issues. Bearer or Registered Bonds


Bonds may be registered as to brincipal or as to principal and interest. Scrip critificates, non-negotiable, or phyable to bearer, in accordance with the choice of the copicant for registered of bearer bonds, will be issued after allotment in exchange for provisional receipts. When these scrip certificates have been paid in full, and payment endorsed thereon by the bank receiving the money they may be exchanged for bonds, when prepared, with coupons attached, they able to bearer, or registered as to principal, or for fully registered bonds when prepared, with the application

Delivery of interim certificates and of definitive bonds will be made through the Chartered Banks. Bearer bonds with coupons will be based in denominations of \$52, \$100, \$500, and \$1,000, and may be registered as to principal only. Fully registered bonds, the interest on which is paid direct to the owner by Covernment theque, will be issued in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, of any authorized multiple of \$5,000.

Subject to the payment of 25 cents for each new bond issued Lowers of fully registered bonds without coupons, will have the right to convert into bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 with coupons, and holders of bonds with coupons will have the right to convert into fully registered bonds of authorized denominations without ronpons, at any time, on application to the Minister of Finance.
