Houlton, Nov. 13—The potato shippers of Houlton and vicinity held a meeting on Saturday afternoon relative to the buying and selling of potatoes by the hundred weight. Many present did not understand the matter of securing a license and the meeting proved to be a very profitable one. The meeting was held at the office of the E. L. Cleveland Co. and was called by W. S. Blake one of the local buyers, who acted as chairman. All present agreed to secure licenses and to start in Monday morning, Nov. 12, under the new rule of buying and selling potatoes. Aroostook county has never bought before by the pound and when the matter was first agitated many looked with disfavor upon this new move, but after getting together and talking and studying things out many are of the opinion that this will be much the better way.

Eulogy on Late General Maude

London, Nov. 20.—Premier Lloyd George, in announcing General Maude's death to the House of Commons yesterday, characterized him as "a great leader of men and a commander of the first rank."

The Premier briefly reviewed General Maude's career and told of the difficulties he overcame, which resulted in the capture of Bagdad and other successes in Mesopotamia.

"Now in the hour of triumph," said the Premier, "he is stricken down by fell disease. The country mourns the loss of one of its most valiant sons."
