

Artificial Coloring of Sugar Prohibited by the Government

Learning Germany's secrets

St. John Globe
Captain Franz Rinteln, convicted along with two Americans, David Lamar and Henry B. Martin, of conspiring to disrupt the munitions traffic between the United States and the Entente powers, is said to be a German of high rank and social distinction. He was arrested by British agents while making his way back to Germany under an assumed name and with a fraudulent passport, and returned to America before war was declared on the strength of promises he had given to disclose his activities. That he has kept his word is indicated both by the convictions now recorded and by more or less open hints that the authorities are in

possession of valuable information which has not been publicly disclosed. The trial of Rinteln and his colleagues resulted in remarkable disclosures, not the least interesting being the revelation that through the instrumentality of his agents in Labor's National Peace League, Rinteln secured the assistance of the silver-tongued William J. Bryan and of the astute Henry Ford. Through the plausible arguments of the paid agents of Rinteln, who disbursed upwards of half a million dollars of German gold, both Bryan and Ford were

brought to lend their name and influence to a movement they regarded as a real peace movement, but which was in reality one of Germany's many schemes to win the war by checking the flow of supplies to the real champions of liberty and freedom. It was easier for Rinteln's agents to secure Bryan than Ford, for the business man gave many hours of serious thought to the question before finally consenting to let his name be used as one of those who was with drawing from banks financing munition workers the many millions he had on deposit. The disclosures at the Washington trial showed not only how skilfully and how insidiously the Germans worked to create public opinion, but how some of their most powerful advocates were won to give support to a cause directly at variance with that they had at heart. Rinteln, who escaped death in England as a spy by his promise to return to America and help stamp out the German propaganda of crime, may be shown further clemency in being sent to a detention camp instead of to prison to serve the sentence he has pronounced fair and just. What his innocent victims think of the court exposures has not been openly recorded. They have good cause for reflecting on the truth of the old adage, "More flies are caught with molasses than with vinegar." While the trial disclosures have created wide public interest, it is not the facts publicly disclosed, but the inside information obtained from Rinteln and others like him that have been of the greatest value to the United States. As a consequence of these disclosures government agents know pretty well all the active agents of the enemy, and can in the event of any hostile moves quickly put the screws on would-be leaders. For that reason there is little apprehension of overt acts by alien enemies.

The Potato Products Company is making contracts for potatoes in the fields and will purchase any quantity. The company will re open its plant in August, and will add a starch system so that the small potatoes will not be wasted. It has a contract with the British government to furnish 1,000,000 pounds a month of its prepared potatoes and turnips. It has also a market at a good price for all the starch it can turn out. M. S. Clark, the foreman, has just returned from P. E. I. where he was buying potatoes, is now getting the starch system installed and making other preparations for the late summer opening.

This is the Proper Way to Crack Nuts and Avoid Profanity

times. Now, there is no real reason why careless people should subject their hands to vicious poundings in the process of cracking nuts. A nut cracking block is the device that relieves human kind of this burden. The block can be any size or thickness, just so it is thick enough to permit the sinking of a few holes of different sizes to hold different size nuts.

The nuts are then placed in these holes and hammered at will. Another feature of this little aid to sunny dispositions is that the nuts are cracked in much better form for eating, as the force of the blow can be better regulated, as well as the amount of nut that is struck and the place where the striking takes effect.

Cross Atlantic in 8 Days

Spanish interests are planning to build a railroad from the straits of Gibraltar to the point in Africa nearest South America, whence the Atlantic could be crossed by steamer in three days, reducing the time between Spain and Brazil to five days.

The Salt of the Sea

A regular task of the oceanographers is to take observations of the saltiness of the sea, which varies greatly in different localities. They do this by sending down on the trawl line by specimen bottles arranged to fill, and close at any desired depth. Thus it has been learned that the North Atlantic is considerably saltier than the North Pacific, and that the saltiest of all the great seas are the Mediterranean, the Red and especially the Adriatic. Some patient statisticians has calculated that if all salt in the sea were evaporated and spread over this country, it would cover Canada with salt more than a mile and a half deep.
