Home Efficiency Clubs of New Brunswick

Food Preservation Campaign

During 1917, "The Home Efficiency Clubs" of New Brunswick were organized, as a means of giving girls from ten to eighteen years of age, an opportunity to do their bit in Food Preservation.

At the beginning of 1918, Miss Marjorie Fiewelling was appointed Supervisor of the Girls' Clubs, and she has now over 200 live organizations of young people under her direction.

Last year the Domestic Science Teachers of the Province volunteered to help in the work and gave three weeks of their vacation to the service, free of charge.

To prepare for this, they will meet at the Normal School, Fredericton, from July 9 to 13, and take a short course in methods of Food Preservation, Food Values, and Club activities generally.
