MAYONNAISE MIXER

Here's a Hint to Housewives Who Want Better Results

How many housewives are there who endeavor to apologize for the "curdled" or unwhipped appearance of their mayonnaise dressing because the oil and the other constituents of the dressing have not been properly mixed?

Yet it is a simple matter to have the proper mixture attained if a little mechanical appliance that anyone can secure is used. All that is necessary is a bracket to which an egg beater can be screwed with a shelf far enough under it to hold the bowl in which the dressing is to be mixed and permit the egg beater to reach the bottom of the bowl.

There is a ring on the opposite side of the bracket to which the egg beater is affixed large enough to hold an ordinary funnel. The oil is placed in the funnel and a cork is placed in the small end to regulate the flow to a drop at a time.

Bird House Exhibition

The boys of Broadway and Fisher Memorial Schools attending the Manual Training department held a splendid exhibition of bird houses in their rooms in the Vocational school on Saturday afternoon, April 27. Most of the houses were built for robins and martins, but there were a few other houses for wrens, flickers, barn swallows, chipping sparrows, etc. The exhibition consisted of 71 houses made of packing boxes.
