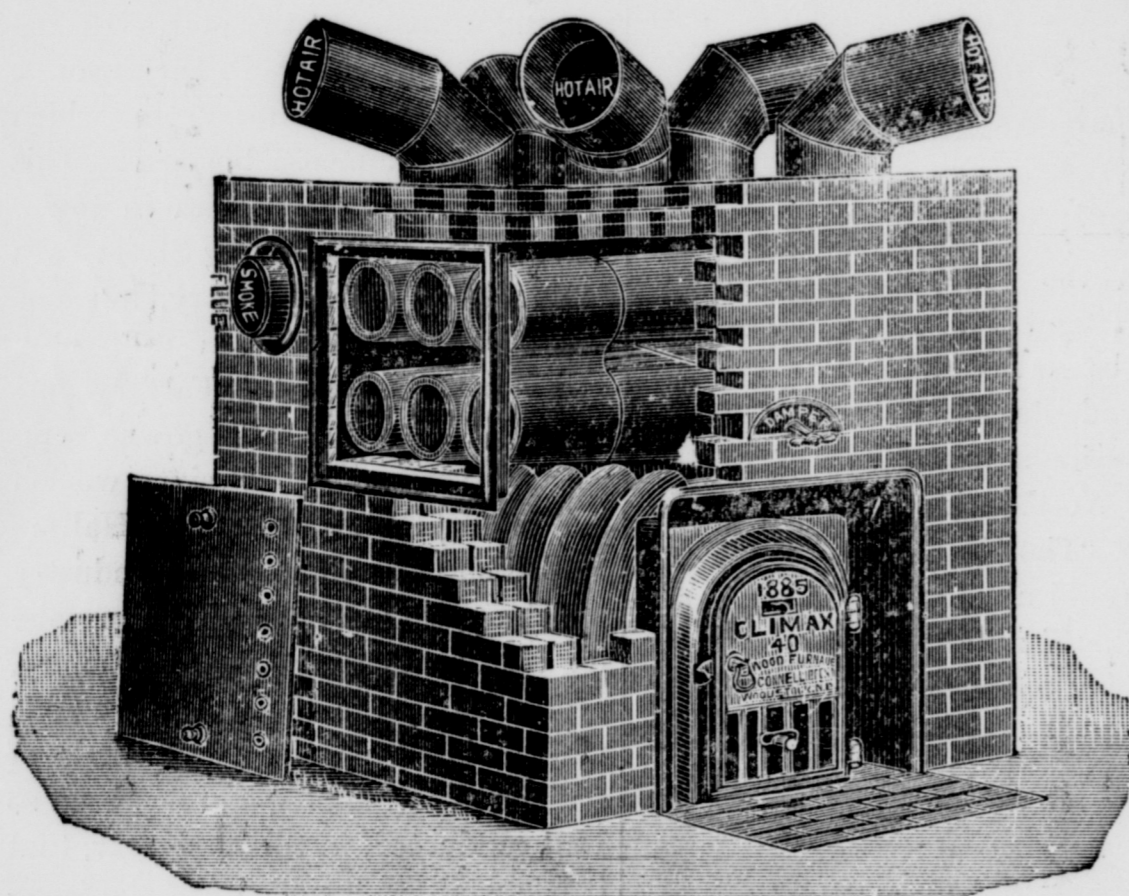
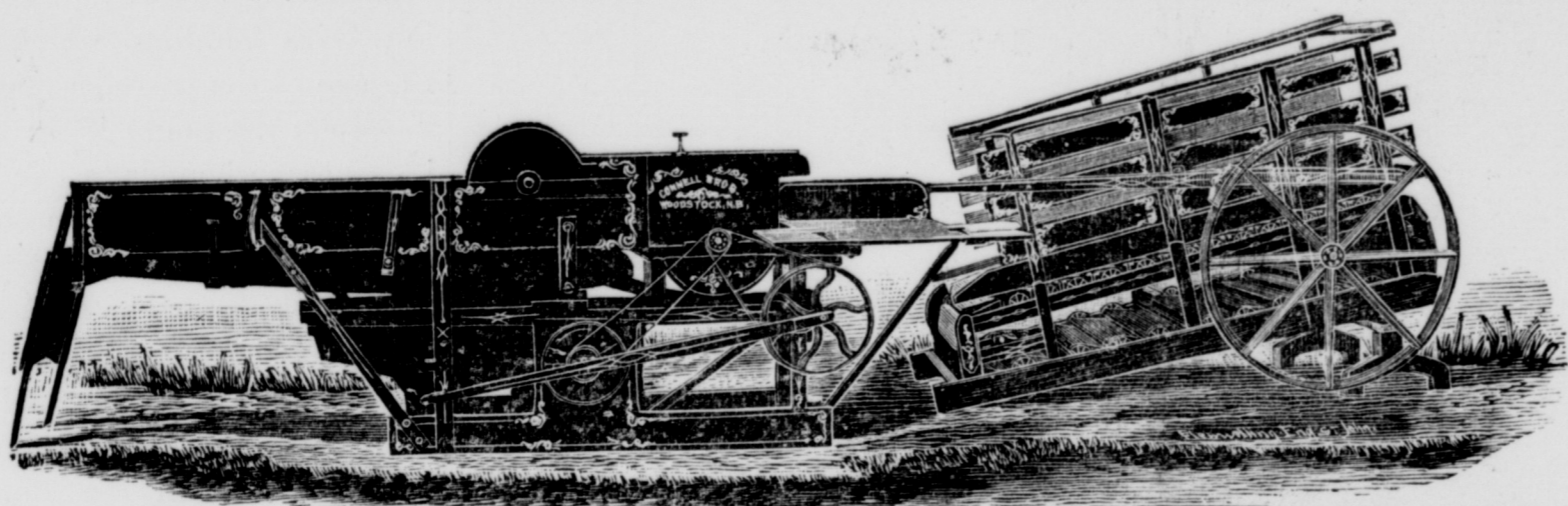
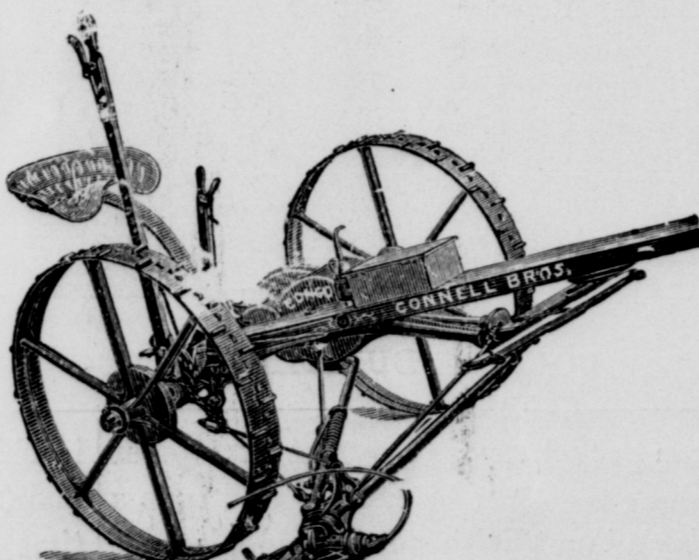
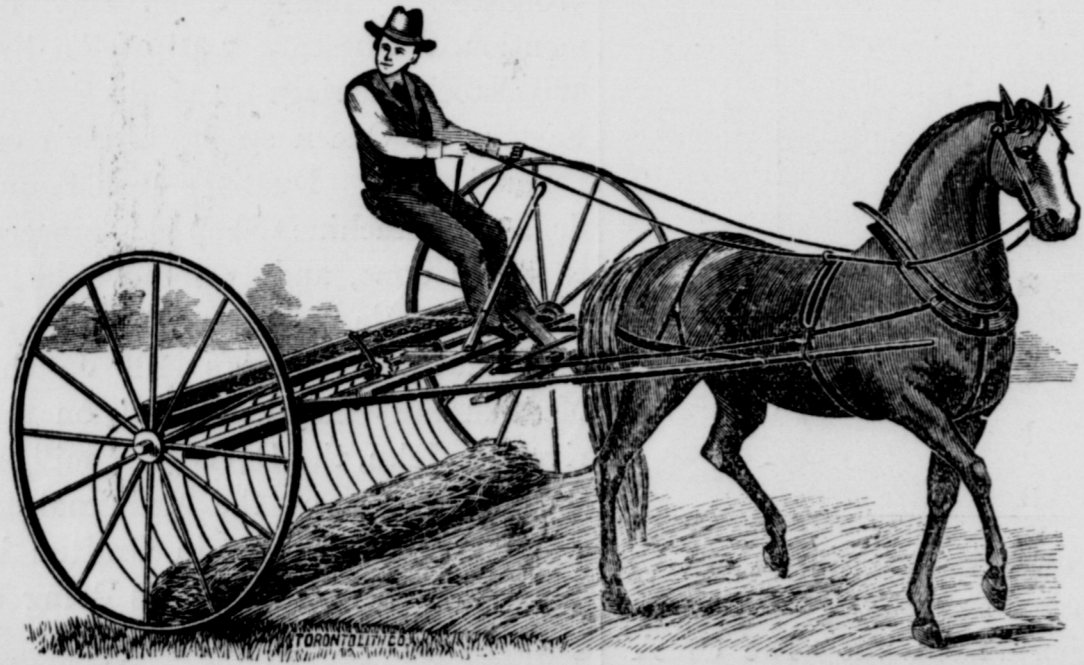
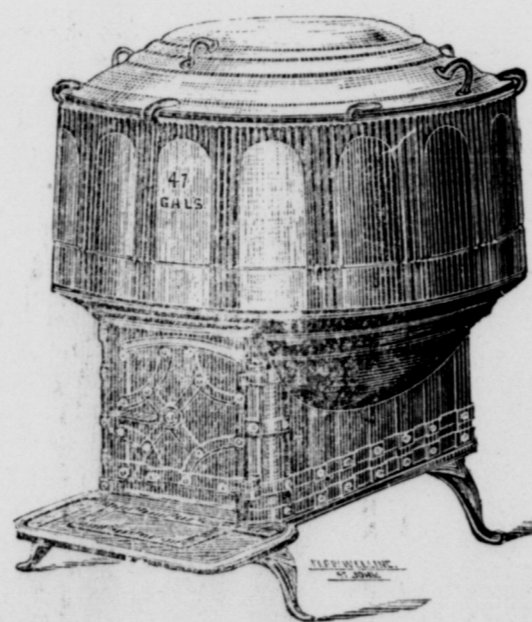
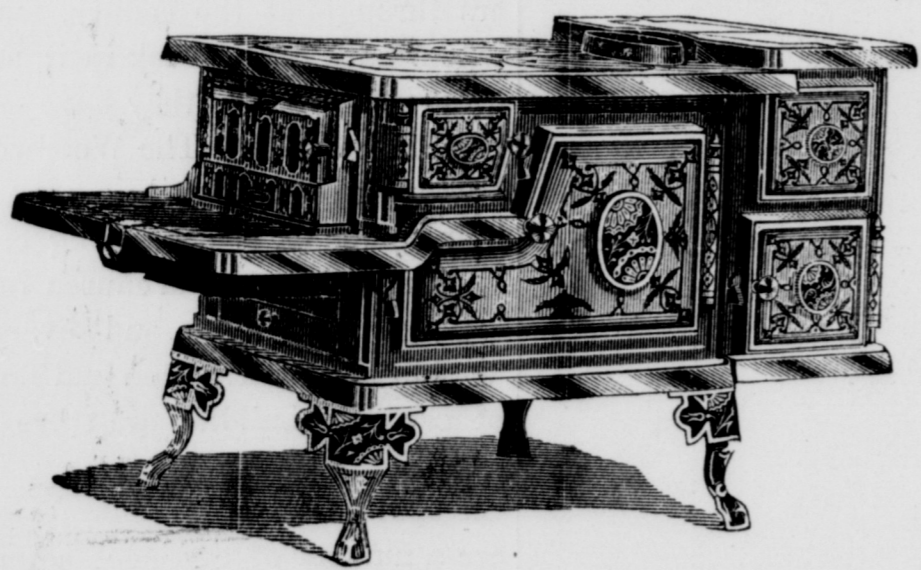


VIEW OF CHAPEL STREET, SHOWING METHODIST CHURCH.

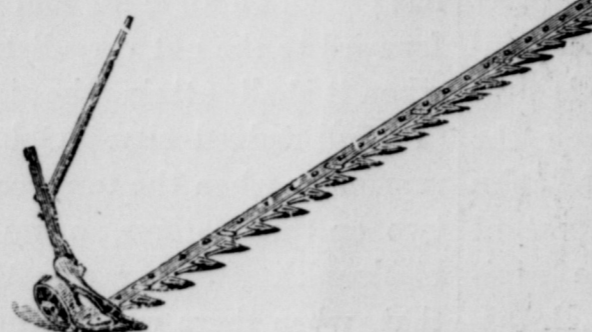

H. H. McCain, M. P. P., was born at Florenceville in 1854. His parents came from Belfast, Ireland. He has been a wide awake and energetic farmer and has a very happy way of succeeding in the things he under-

takes. In 1884 Mr. McCain started the first cash market for country produce at Florenceville and has been engaged in the produce business ever since. He was elected to the Local Legislature in 1895.

W. B. Jewett is one of Woodstock's live and reliable business men. He was born in this town in 1850. He learned the watch making business with R. D. Baker, when he was a young man. In 1874 he opened a jewelry store and is now the proprietor of the oldest establishment of that kind in town. Early in his business career he had some serious encounters
