The semi-annual meeting of the County Council of the Municipality of the County of York, was held at the City Council Chambers in the City of Fredericton on Tuesday, the 6th of July, 1880. There were present:

Mr. Colter moved that all the Parish Officers appointed at the semi-annual meeting in January be confirmed—carried.

Mr. Grant moved that Geo. Dickson be appointed special commissioner for the Parish of Canterbury, in the room of Darius Dickenson, deceased—carried.

On the motion of Mr. Close, Israel Smith was appointed special constable of the Board.

Mr. Glendenning moved that N. Piers be made Land Commissioner for Manners Sutton—carried.

Mr. Grant moved that Charles Reed be appointed Surveyor of lumber for the Parish of Canterbury.

Messrs. Lawson and Goodspeed moved the passing of Bye Laws relating to the running at large of cattle in their Parishes, but withdrew them at the Secretary Treasurer saying that he would bring in general by-law.

Mr. Colter moved that the polling place No. 1 District, Parish of Douglas be changed to the High School House—carried.

Mr. Close moved that Geo. S. Peters, Ferryman, have liberty from the Council to tear away the remains of the old wharf in the rear of the County Court House, the said wharf being a great inconvenience to him in landing his ferryboat, especially in rainy weather—carried.

On the motion of Mr. Murch, it was resolved that the Secretary should place \$50 to the credit of the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Queensbury, and charge the same to said Parish—carried.

Mr. March notified the committee on Debentures to meet at half-past one. On the matter being brought before the notice of the Board by the Warden.

A conversational discussion ensued on the question of converting the basement of the Court House into offices, etc. Mr. Coburn asked, had the City and County Councils power to make the alteration, if they had, they should proceed to make it. The Secretary-Treasurer explained that they had no power without an Act of Assembly. Mr. Close explained how it was that the committee to whom the matter was referred at the January meeting, and who prepared the Bill, did not take steps to have it submitted to the Legislature. They were prepared, on the part of the

County Council to bear an equal portion of the expense of the alteration, but, as the committee acting for the city would not agree to that, they thought better to let matters slide, than have the bill brought before the Legislature. Mr. Nason thought it better to let well alone, and abandon the project altogether, as the funds of the County were not in a state to bear the expense. He thought the matter was one of intrigue, only among a few in the city, for he had heard of no complaints from people outside as to the present location and want of accommodation in the public offices.

Mr. Calhoun did not at all agree with the statement that no complaints were made by people outside the city. The difficulty regarding the apportionment of the expense arose from the fact that it was thought, by those acting for the city, that the expenses of the offices of Sec-Treas and Auditor should be borne by the County Council better, he thought, to let the matter stand for another year. Mr. Nason said, if the alteration was made, the County would have no free market. Mr. Close strongly denied that there was any intriguing on the part of any one in the city to bring about the alteration. The motion then dropped.

Some discussion then followed, in which Messrs. Colter, Goodspeed, Rutherford, Henry, Close, Nason, Coburn and the Sec-Treas, took part in a case brought up by Mr. Colter, where the valuator of the Parish of Douglas had reduced the valuation of the real estate owned by a party in the said Parish, \$22,810, as the law stood the total valuation of the Parish would be increased by the amount of the reduction, and he contended that it should be reduced by the amount.

Mr. Colter read a resolution to that effect. In course of conversation the case of a party holding large tracts of wild land was added, where, he might be said, the valuation was too high, and the valuator might make a reduction, but it was urged, that where in a particular case a reduction was made the valuator should reduce the valuation on the whole real estate of the Parish in proportion to that reduction. Some were inclined to doubt whether, after a valuation was established, to hold for five or ten years, the valuator had power to alter it. The 61st sec. of Chapter 100, Consolidated Statutes, was quoted to show that they had the power. An amendment was moved to Mr. Colter's resolution to make it embrace the real estate of residents as well as non-residents; finally, Mr. Colter withdrew his resolution, to the understanding that he would bring it up, amended, in the afternoon.

The Council then separated.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Council having met pursuant to adjournment, the Secretary-Treasurer read the roll. The Warden asked if there was any report from the Chairman of the Committee on the adjustment of the Administration of Justice account. No reply being given.

Mr. Jewett, Chairman of the Committee on the report of the Secretary Treasurer's Accounts, reported that the committee had attended to their duty and found the accounts correct. Report received.

Mr. Foster moved that a committee of three be appointed to whom shall be referred all matters relating to the accounts of the Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Canterbury, prior to the division of the Parish, with a view of ascertaining the amount, if any, on hand at the time of the division, and the amount of the indebtedness, if any, at that time on account of the Support of the Poor. Carried, Messrs. Goodspeed, Murch, and Doherty, who the auditor were appointed the committee to report at the next January Session.

Mr. Close inquired whether the Administration of Justice Account for that year had been adjusted with the city, and whether the accounts for the two years previous, which had been adjusted, had been paid.

Secretary Treasurer answered that the present year's account had not been adjusted, nor the two which had been adjusted, paid.

Mr. Close, Chairman of the Committee, (viz, B. Close, T. Coburn and D. Lipsett), appointed at the last January meeting of the County Council to superintend the Jail and Court House, reported the following:—The Jail, which they have caused steel gratings to be put on two of the rooms of the jail, and made other repairs which were necessary; and also that the Government having requested the use of the Court House for the meeting of the Supreme and Equity Courts, and also for the Law Library until the completion of the Parliament Building, we made the necessary repairs and preparations at the expense of the Government, and agreed not to charge rent for their occupation; and also in accordance with resolution passed at last meeting, for suitable accommodation for County Council, we got twenty-six desks for the use of the Council, at a cost of \$3.60 each, made by Jackson Adams, his being the lowest tender. Adopted.
