York County Council.

Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday,
 20th, 21st and 22nd Jan. 1880.

TUESDAY, JAN. 20.

The Semi-Annual Meeting of the County Council of the Municipality of the County of York, was held in the Court House, in the City of Fredericton, on Tuesday, the 20th day of January, 1880. The elected Councillors being assembled, the roll was called, and all answered to their names, saving Mr. Henry, who soon after put in his appearance.

praying that the same pass and become law; also Resolved, that a Bill be presented to the Legislature at the next Session authorizing the City Collector to collect tolls and fees on all country produce in the Queen's Ward Market, as well as in the Phoenix Square Market; and further Resolved, that a copy of this Resolution be forthwith forwarded to the County Council and published.

The Warden thereon asked the Board what action they would take.

Mr. Close said a committee should be appointed to oppose the Resolution, the County Council, both as regards the separate city member, and the collecting of tolls in the Court House Market.

Mr. Henry referring to the latter Resolution, thought that the Chief Justice had arrived at a very proper decision on the legal question in the County Council's favor, and it ought to have been final.

Finally a resolution was unanimously passed.

Mr. Mason moved the Auditor's Report into which might be inserted. He thought that that was the only way to get at the evil. If the amendment was changed so as to admit of the Board obtaining supplementary accounts he would be in favor of it.

Mr. Nelson was in favor of the amendment. He thought that the publication of the Auditor's Report might be delayed until the Board had a meeting, and the time might be lost. Members of the Board could have access to the accounts of the Auditor General. He was opposed to supplementary estimates as unnecessary and as a waste of time.

Messrs. Calhoun and Rutherford coincided entirely with Mr. Goodspeed, with regard to the supplementary accounts.

The Warden then read for the information of the Board a memo of amounts received since the Auditor General's account was made up, November 30th, 1879, to January 10th, 1880, which the following is a recapitulation:—

Finally Mr. Henry added the following clause to the resolution.

Resolved, that a supplementary account be published of all receipts up to the meeting of Council as near as possible. The resolution being then put an amendment to the Auditor's Report was carried.

The list of the Parish Officers of Canterbury was then confirmed.

Mr. Doherty, Chairman of the Committee (whose other members were Messrs. Lawson, Grant, Feeny and Foster) appointed Chapter 42, Sec. 1879, to carry out the provisions of Section 6 of the said Act read their report.

They have attended to their duty, and find that the valuation of the Parish of North Lake is \$119,211. The amount of indebtedness is divided between the two said Parishes in proportion to their value they find to be \$1,584.25 and the proportion chargeable to the Parish of North Lake is \$1,170.94, \$442.28 in all (\$1,164.28).

Should it hereafter be discovered that any amount of the indebtedness has been omitted or any error has been made in computing the same, the amount shall be divided between the said Parishes in like proportion. The Committee would also request the Secretary-Treasurer be directed in and by said Act to divide the same as follows:—

Report received and adopted.

List of Parish Officers of Prince William confirmed.

Mr. Nelson opened up the question of delinquent returns, and moved resolution calling on the Secretary-Treasurer to notify all the Justices of the Peace for the Parish of Douglas, who have delinquent lists in their hands for collection, to make complete returns of such to him on or before the 1st day of March. They were anxious to have a clean sheet in the County.

Mr. Goodspeed was in favor of a general resolution or something to that effect. He did not think that any of the Justices of the Peace of the County did not do what was right, but still the Council should urge upon the Justices to be notified that they must make returns.

Secretary-Treasurer assured members of the Board, that he had not neglected notifying the Justices. He could show them bundles of returns, and he wished to clear himself.

Mr. Hoyt thought that something more stringent and extended than Mr. Colter's resolution was needed. What they as members of the Council wanted, was to get the bills in the hands of the Justices into their own hands. The Secretary-Treasurer had power to demand the giving up of any property belonging to the County in the hands of any Justice or Collector. Finally he moved resolution in amendment, that the Secretary-Treasurer compel all Justices to return all moneys and delinquent lists in their hands on or before the 1st day of May next. Carried.

Mr. Rutherford said that the \$120 in Auditor's Report amount of delinquent rates placed in P. Maloney's hand for collection by himself as Justice in Manners-Sutton had been paid up, and he wished to clear himself.

Mr. Sleep moved that the list of Parish Officers of Queensbury be confirmed—carried.

Mr. Veasey moved that the list of Parish Officers of North Lake be confirmed—carried.

Mr. Nelson moved that the list of Parish Officers of New Maryland be confirmed—carried.

Mr. Veasey moved special assessment for the Parish of North Lake. Support the poor \$150.00; \$28.50 of the above to be paid to the overseers of the poor in the Parish of Canterbury. Parish Clerk, \$2.00; towards paying the indebtedness of the County, \$100; Parish contingencies, \$150. Assessing 3 per cent, collecting 5 per cent.

Mr. Close read petition of Mr. Whitman Haines for ferry license at landing at St. Mary's. There was some discussion over the respective rights of the County and city, in the matter. No action was taken.

Mr. Masten read return of the jurymen summoned to meet at the mouth of the Camp-bet Settlement, and to inquire into the necessity of opening up said road to the river St. John, and appraise the damages. The said Jurymen appraised the damages at \$75 for Furham for the road, and \$5.50 for expense of laying out said road, paying Justice of Peace for issuing warrant, and presiding at investigation of jury, Jury fees, etc. He would like to ask the Council if it were possible to make return of the jurymen, had been duly sworn according to law. There was a petition being signed against the owners of the damages, etc.

Secretary-Treasurer could not give his opinion on the legality of returns until all proceedings were filed.

Finally it was agreed that the matter stand over until the July Session.

Mr. Calhoun moved that the list of the Parish Officers of Stanley be confirmed—carried.

Mr. Lawson brought on the subject of providing better and more sufficient accommodation for the members of the Council, and moved that the Committee on Public Buildings be instructed to have the table of the Council room to be provided, and chairs so as to accommodate the Councillors all assembled. Mr. Close raised the question of changing the time of meeting from the third to the first Tuesday of January, so that the County Council might have an opportunity of meeting in the Court House.

On the motion of Mr. Goodspeed the resolution was laid over until after dinner that the Council might have an opportunity of seeing the table of the Council room.

The list of Parish Officers for the Parishes of Manners-Sutton and Douglas were confirmed.

Mr. Nelson moved that the Assessors and Collectors of New Maryland receive the same per centage as last year.

Mr. Rutherford said he wished to move a resolution. The Common Council of St. John's City at a meeting passed a resolution to petition the Dominion Government to subsidize a line of steamers direct from St. John to Great Britain, and had called on all similar bodies outside themselves to support them in their endeavor; and whereas the County of York of such a line of steamers would be immense. The raising of cattle was going to be the great thing now, and York, he thought, ought to be well in that way as any place else. He then read the resolution:—
