inches thick, hollow, with a shell two inches thick all round it. There is an inch hole in the centre of one end, the other end is conical in shape, so that when standing on its end it looks like a shell. Over the hole in the level end is a stout cap of boiler iron fit-

The most wonderful and marvelous success ted carefully. Explosive material is placed inside this shell, the top closes with screws
