## Telegraph Cables in Sewers.

disuse of telegraph poles in cities is being made in Washington, D. C., by the Mutual Union Telegraph Company. Having received permission to run their wires through the common sewers of the city, the company began the work of placing the wires June 6th. The wires which are needed for the city service and for connection with lines outside the city are twisted cable form and covered with a non-conductor and waterproof coating. Outside the city limits these wires emerge from the sewers and join those placed upon poles. The cable made of the twisted wires is a ttached firmly to the arched roof or tow of t he sewer, and thus raised above all interference from water, except in case of floods. The cables are laid by men enveloped in rubber clothing and provided with safety lanterns, provisions being made for conduct-




