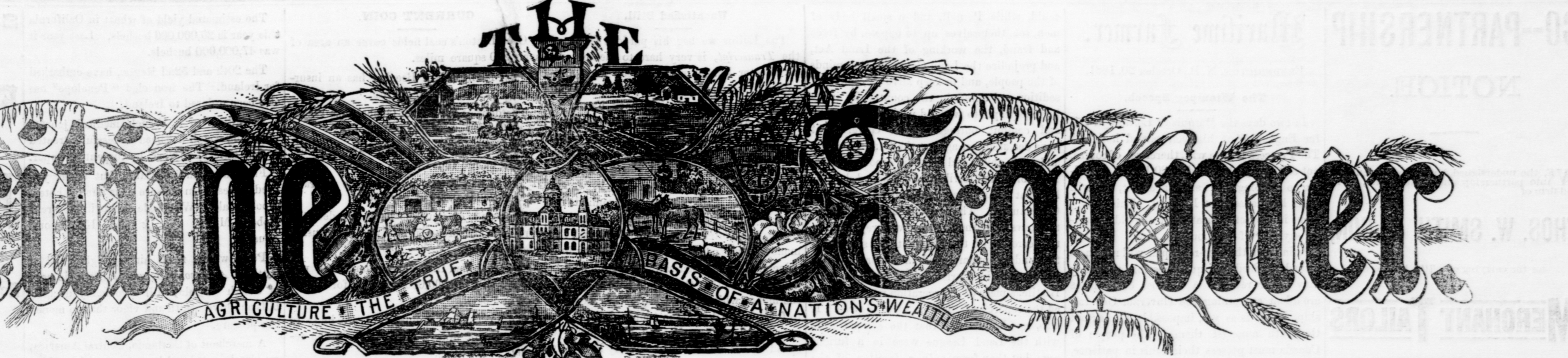

The annual exhibition of the Queen's Central Agricultural Society was held in their hall at Upper Water Street, Queen's County, on Tuesday, the 11th inst. The morning was cold and blustery and no doubt had the effect of keeping a good many away...

The Show of the Union Society, King's Co. On Wednesday, 11th inst., the annual show of the "Union" Society, of King's Co., was held at Clifton, a pretty little village across the Kennebecasis, from the Parish of Rothesay.

The "Union" is one of our oldest and most vigorous Societies, having been organized thirty-two years ago. Its annual fair has been a fixed institution for a number of years, but this is the first time that Clifton has been honored as the scene, Kingston, the former shire town of King's, and Springfield having been chosen alternately.

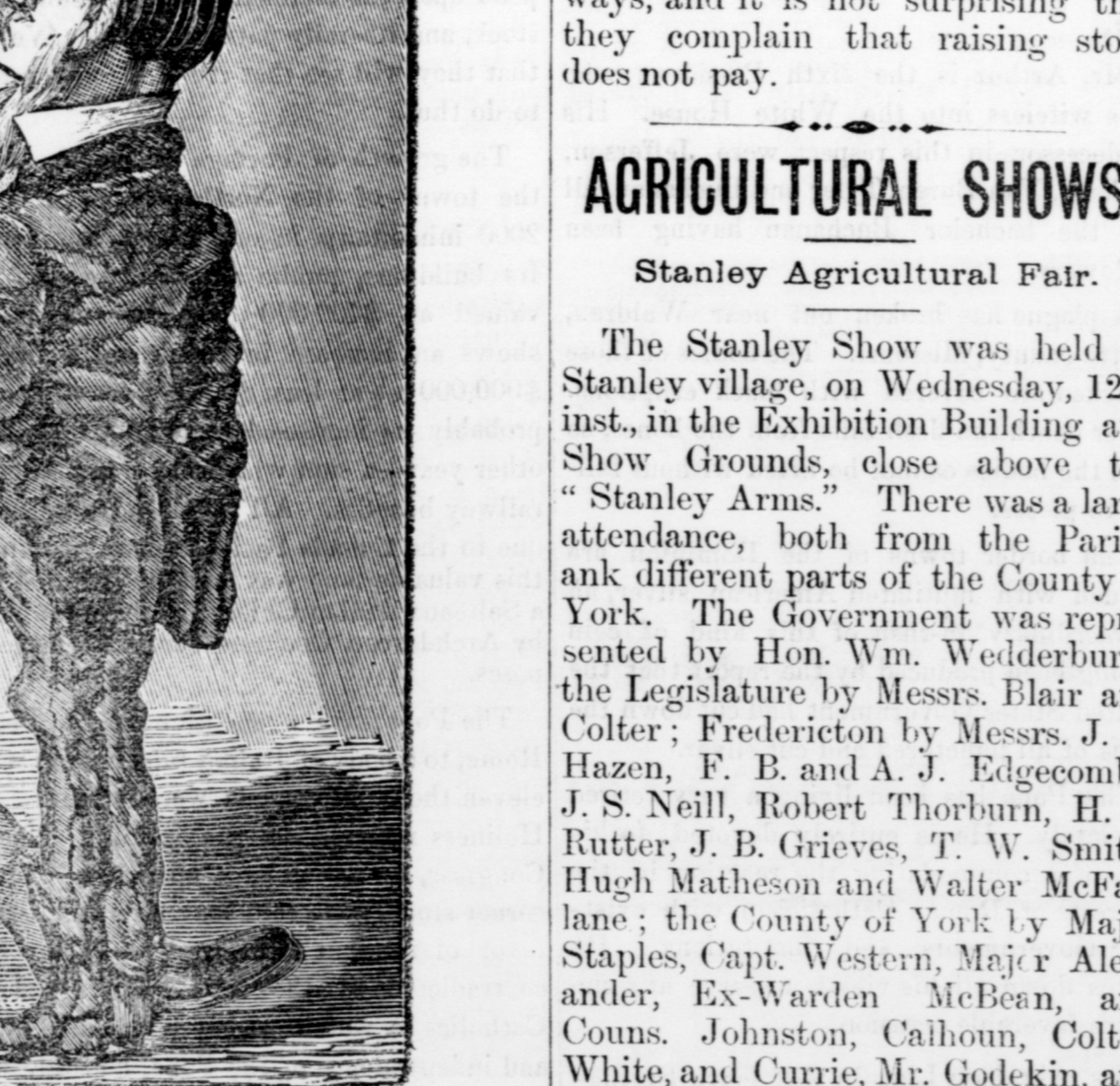
On the grounds during the day, the great assemblage represented to a very great degree the agricultural wealth and intelligence of King's Co., and was drawn from a radius of twenty miles. The number of visitors to the show was one of the finest ever seen in the County, the premium list in almost every class being filled.

From a comparatively limited area of country, there were exhibits in Jerseys, Ayrshires and Devons, that would have done credit to a Provincial Exhibition. Mr. A. C. Fairweather, who has won a Canadian reputation as an amateur farmer and stock raiser, had a portion of his Jerseys at the show. Messrs. Chas. Foster, T. T. H. Scovill, J. S. Marvin, and J. W. Devons were also present, and the quality of which there was a fine exhibit, and in Ayrshires the prominent names, many of whom are well known to readers of the MARITIME FARMER, were James E. Fairweather, Chas. Dixon, S. B. Belding, S. E. Frost and Gilbert Williams. Some fine Leicesters and sheep were shown in pens, but the display in this class was not up to the other features of the Exhibition.

The Moulding Shop of Mr. G. Hudson, Freewalling, a building of quite extended proportions, was utilized for the display of POWELS, DAILY, AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE AND MANUFACTURED ARTICLES which was certainly very fine.

The leading poultry fanciers of St. John, Col. Blaine, Wilson Bros., Snider Bros., Edward C. Woods, R. W. Magee, and D. Magee, were there with a splendid show, which was largely supplied by Mr. O. W. Wetmore, of Clifton and others in that locality. The show of manufactured articles useful and fancy, was much beyond what I have ever seen at a local exhibition. King's does not get much on the exhibition, but the farmers wives make excellent butter, which was very largely shown. This portion of the Province has suffered less than any other during the past season from the continued rains, so the show of roots, etc., was perhaps better than could be made by any other section. Taken as a whole then, the exhibition, was very successful, for which the energetic President and Secretary of the Society, Mr. Geo. Goreham and Mr. James Cookson, worked hard. During the afternoon, the 62nd Batt. Band of St. John was present and delighted the visitors with a programme, played in the exhibition building. Strange to say this was the first occasion on which a band of music visited Clifton. In the evening there was the inevitable Bonnet Hop, at which the Band also played.

The contrivance being round, the chickens crowd one another. By being 5 inches deep in from the side, the chickens cannot get one another's feet in between the small ones, and another or crowd them. As it has no corners, chickens can move at all times out of one another's way, which is a great advantage. The rearer being of iron, no lice, etc., can get near the chicks if taken from the hens when hatched, or if hatched with an incubator.
