

TERRIBLE CALAMITY AT HALIFAX
The Poor's Asylum Burned, and
Thirty-five Lives Lost.

The Poor's Asylum, Halifax, twelve stories high, and one of the largest buildings in the Maritime Provinces, was destroyed by fire Monday night, and thirty-five of the inmates were in the upper rooms, and most of them in hospital, some aged people and other children, met a terrible death in the flames.

About midnight, while all hands were sleeping, the fire broke out in the bake house in the basement of the asylum. It is one of the largest buildings in the Maritime Provinces. Exactly how the fire arose is not very clear, but the smoke of smouldering wood spread through the building into the crowded dormitories, and caused the utmost terror among the 400 or 500 inmates of the institution.

There was no immediate danger so the officials of the asylum did not at once take steps to remove the people. The flames in the basement of the main building spread to the elevator, reaching to the top of the twelve story building, running up the shaft with fearful velocity, and set fire to the upper stories in a few seconds. In the tenth story was the hospital of the institution and it was about seventy helpless patients, most of whom were unable to leave their beds.

People early on the scene (the building is a mile or two out of town) were engaged in moving the inmates to the upper stories, and the hospital, not thinking that the fire was in immediate danger. When they heard the great roar of flames and saw the light coming from the windows, they fled to the hospital itself, half a dozen patients were got out through a passage leading into the wings, but the majority of them perished. Some of them in the frenzy of the struggle dragged themselves from the windows and were unable to dash themselves against the windows and clinging to the sashes till the flames licked them off, they fell back into the scorching air below, the eyes of the hundreds far down below, powerless to aid them.

Attempts were made to erect ladders, but they were too short, and the flames and falling slabs and melted lead from the roof, and bricks from the chimneys drove the firemen back again and again.

When the chairman of the fireward arrived on the spot he found that the fire was burning fiercely, though there had been ten streams of water on the flames from the hydrants in the vicinity and the three steam fire engines. The fire was extinguished in the basement and it was hoped that a great conflagration had been averted, but suddenly the flames appeared in the upper part of the building, and firemen entered the rooms dislodged. Again the devouring element was brought under subjection, but soon the top of the main building was in flames, and the work of the night continued in earnest. When the doors were opened, between one and two hundred of the poor people were discerned surging down the stairs, tumbling over each other. frantic with grief, and uttering prayers for help came from the helpless inmates. Some were clothed partly or wholly, others enveloped in blankets, and more were naked. Very few had any shoes on their feet. Young and old were tenderly handed out to willing helpers. Scores of little children might be seen, not with the anguish of their parents, but with delight on their countenances, but started at the novelty of the proceedings. In all perhaps fifty or sixty of these either came by themselves or were carried down stairs, and here and there it was necessary to stop the surging crowd while some little unfortunate almost crushed to death was rescued from the fire.

It was thought that through the different exits all the inmates had escaped, but suddenly a cry was raised from a woman in the sixth story, on the north side of the building. She leaned on the sill with her head and shoulders out, and remained there in sight of the spectators until the floor gave way under her, and with one despairing cry, she sank into the flames, and in a few moments was no longer to be seen. There were no ladders that would reach to within twenty feet of her. This woman was on the hospital flat.

At the time it could not be known how many were there. The whole place by this time was one sheet of flames, and attempt at rescue would be hopeless. The firemen then turned their attention to the west end of the building to endeavor to save it. The men entered it and reached the third story with the hose to keep the fire in the centre of the building. But the fire worked with an underground and cut off the firemen's escape. They rushed through the flames and smoke down the burning stairway, abandoning the hose and narrowly escaping with their lives. The whole building was then in flames, and the attention of the firemen was next directed to saving the wooden buildings, boiler house, etc., where the inmates had been temporarily placed, and this attempt was also unsuccessful. It was nearly six o'clock Tuesday morning before the "all out" was sounded and the firemen went home.

There was \$50,000 insurance on the building. It was the property of the Provincial Government.

THE LEES' SENTENCE.
Twenty Years in the Penitentiary.
The Prisoners Acquitted of Shooting at the Police Magistrate.

Since July last, Newton and George M. Lee have been making the public a laughing stock, as the participants with Thomas Virtue in some of the gravest crimes perpetrated in the community for many years, the facts of which are fresh in the memory of our readers. On the first trial in which they were charged with shooting Sergeant Vandine in George Lee's barn, on the 31st of July, they were found guilty in October, and on the second charge, that of attempting to shoot Police Magistrate, they were acquitted on Thursday last. The third and last charge against them, for attempting to shoot Sergeant Vandine at his own house, was not pressed, and on Monday morning the closing chapter in the lengthy trials was read to the prisoners by Mr. Justice Steadman, who sentenced Newton Lee and George M. Lee to

TWENTY YEARS SERVICE in the Dorchester Penitentiary, for the crime of which they had been convicted. In referring to the Lees' case, the late time, it is only just to the legal gentleman engaged thereon, to testify to the remarkable ability and assiduity they displayed throughout the trial. He says that he was engaged for the defence of the prisoners, showed a skill and judgment rarely equalled at our Provincial Bar, and well deserved the complimentary mention by Mr. Justice Steadman of his services in his remarks in sentencing the prisoners as reported further on.

Mr. H. B. Rainsford in his new position of Crown prosecutor at the court opened last week, was assisted by Dr. Tack, Q. C., whose reputation as a criminal lawyer is of many years standing. On Monday forenoon before the court opened, Mr. Rainsford moved that the prisoners be brought forward for sentence, and Mr. Justice Steadman addressing them spoke substantially as follows: "You are brought before me today by a Jury of your countrymen for a very serious offence against the law, found guilty, and it now becomes my duty to pronounce upon you the sentence of the court, but before doing so, I shall take the opportunity of reviewing briefly the circumstances of your trial.

The offence with which you were charged in the first four counts of the indictment seven years ago, would have been expiated by your lives, but in 1875 the Legislature amended the law, and you see how narrowly you have escaped the extreme sentence that could be passed on you. You are young men who might have been an honor to yourselves and your family, but you got off the right track and allowed yourselves to be led into bad ways and evil associations, and you now stand in that dock to receive punishment for one of the gravest offences against the laws of the country. The jurors in your trial, after weighing the testimony against you, found you guilty in the last count, but the evidence would have fully justified them in finding you guilty on every count in the indictment. There is not a doubt in my mind of your guilt in the commission of the crime, neither of your intent which was to shoot Vandine, to prevent your own apprehension. There was certainly no reasonable possibility of your escaping conviction, and the jury could only have been uncertain as to your intent regarding which, however, as I have said, not a particle of doubt exists in my mind. I have not a doubt either, that you, Newton Lee, were

THE PARTY WHO FIRED THE SHOT, and that your intent was to murder Vandine. The law is careful to throw all necessary protection around the officers of the law in the discharge of their duties and dangerous duties, and has made any interference with them a serious crime. The law has left with the

Judge a large discretionary power in passing sentence, and I have to be guided by the circumstances surrounding your case, for which I have said I dissmis from my mind the entire circumstances of the trial in which however there was strong and sufficient evidence to have convicted you. I have not a doubt that you will, Virtue, were the parties who shot at the Police Magistrate. The crime of which you stand convicted, as I have said is a serious one, and had the circumstances been different, you might have escaped a severe punishment. But you had prepared yourself for the commission of the crime. You had loaded yourselves with gunpowder, shot, and caps, and secreted yourselves in a spot to which you knew there was but one approach. This was done in your calm moments, and I am unable to discover any worse case of deliberately planned crime. As I have said I dissmis from my mind the entire circumstances of the second trial, and it is for your diabolical attempt on Vandine's life alone that guides me in passing the sentence upon you today.

I am sorry for the members of the jury in the first trial who signed the affidavit, alleging they misunderstood the intent of the indictment, which was so simple that any man of common sense could understand it. The only deduction of the evidence offered, or of their oath to render a true verdict.
