A Visit to the Lake George Antimony Mines.

To the Editor of the Maritime Farmer:

DEAR SIR.—A few hurried notes of a visit to the Lake George Antimony Mines, which I lately made, in company with a friend whom I shall call Mr. Berry, and who is well acquainted in the vicinity of the mine, may possibly interest some of your readers.

We passed a French settlement on the river which skirts the banks for about twenty miles, it is one of the most picturesque and beautiful in the world. I have seen many. Sometimes we could just catch a glimpse of the river through the trees, at other times a noble expanse of water spread out before our gaze studded here and there with green and cultivated islands.

Some of the farmers in this district must be men of means if the fine, and in some instances splendid houses and spacious barns to be seen every four hundred yards along the road may be taken as evidence. And their farms look as though they were under a high state of cultivation, which goes to explain their prosperity.

We passed a French settlement on the way, and the contrast was rather striking. The houses here seem to be miserable hovels in comparison, and the people who inhabit them appear to be quite poor. It may be that they cannot afford to build better houses, or that like many of their compatriots in Quebec, they are unprogressive and too easy going.
