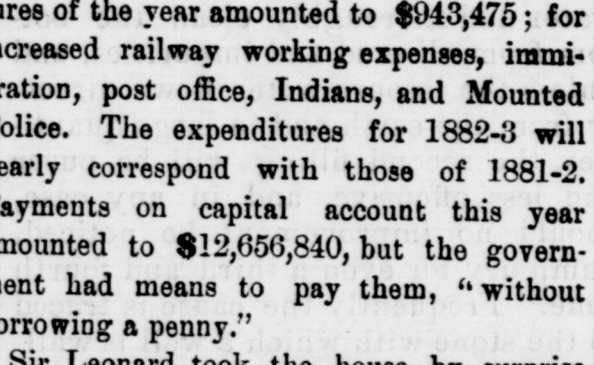
The Budget Speech.

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Agricultural Report.

The Report on Agriculture for 1881, contains the Secretary's general report, the proceedings of the Board of Agriculture during the year, account of stock imported in August 1881, account of sheep and swine and bulls sold, and estimates of the cost of stock on the Farm, accounts of and Provincial Grants to the Agricultural Societies, and the New Brunswick Herd Book.

The Exhibition of 1883.

On Monday, the Provincial Secretary made the statement that it is the intention of the government to hold an Exhibition in St. John, in 1883, and that the attention of the Minister of Agriculture has been called to the co-operation of the Dominion Government.

After March 1, the importation into Canada of head ropes used for tying up cattle in the United Kingdom, as on shipboard, will be prohibited, because it is believed that contagious disease will be communicated by the use of the rope.

Queen Margaret of Italy has among the ladies of her court two Americans whose magnificent jewels almost eclipse the famous diamonds of the Roman princesses. They are the Princess Trigianno Braccacci, nee Field, and the Princess Cenci, nee Spencer.

The Pope expects to purchase for the Vatican the largest topaz in the world, which weighs seven pounds, and upon which famous lapidaries of Naples have been working since 1832, fifty years ago. It has carved upon it representations of Jesus at the Last Supper.

In a single room at Charleston, S. C. there are 1,400 negro children. The teachers are all white—the principal is a man; and the other teachers are women, many of them ladies of great refinement, themselves once mistresses of slaves, whom necessity has compelled to seek employment.

It is strange to note that while the estimates for the army in England are to be largely reduced, the popularity of the service is increasing. An instance is found in the fact that during the stay of the "Black Watch," the 42nd Regiment of the line, in Edinburgh, it more than doubled its strength.

A law has been passed in New York requiring shop-keepers who employ women to sell goods, to provide seats for them so that they shall not be obliged to stand up all day. Summoners were lately issued by one of the city courts, against the three largest retail drygoods firms in New York for violation of this law.

A Committee of ex-Confederate soldiers presented Mrs. Garfield with resolutions of sympathy framed in Tennessee marble. Mrs. Garfield in reply said that it had been the late President's wish that there should be no North or South, but a united country she was continuing further, but grief overcame her.

The Legislatures are now sitting in St. John's, Nfld., Fredericton, Charlottetown, P. E. I., Halifax, N. S., Ottawa, and Toronto; and in a few days will be sitting in Manitoba and British Columbia. For a few weeks politics will certainly reign supreme in the public interest over a vast region of territory.

A Berlin tragedian occasionally gave a pass to his landlady. She was sitting with her little girl in the pit of the theatre, when the heavy villain was about to stab the tragedian in the gizzard. The child, seeing her friend's danger, started up and shrieked out, "Oh, please, don't kill him, or he won't give us any more tickets for the theatre!"

At the court-martial 23rd ult., on Sergeant Mason, who attempted to shoot Guitreau from the goal yard in Washington, the prisoner endeavored to introduce Guitreau's tactics of interrupting the proceedings. As Mason, however, had not succeeded in killing his intended victim, he was not allowed to run that court, and the judge promptly sent him up.

Alarming news comes from Battleford, N. W. T. A large force of Blackfeet has been committing depredations, and murdered several traders. The Sioux also stole a number of horses and drove them across the border. When the owners overtook and rescued them they were prevented by the United States authorities from bringing them back to the Canadian side.

The Court of Enquiry on the loss of the steamer *Moravian* has given judgment generally freeing Capt. Archer from blame, but censuring him for not taking a more southerly course, so as to reach deep water after taking the last sounding. In consideration of the circumstances attending the case, and the Captain's acknowledged abilities as a seaman, they direct that his certificate be returned to him.

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In explaining in the British House of Commons his recent utterance in regard to Home Rule, Mr. Gladstone said the centralization of Parliament should be the cardinal source of great strength, a condition that the only limit, which in principle, is necessary to them is adequate provision for the supremacy of the central authority. He believed a wise and just way of settling the demand for bringing Irish affairs more under Irish control is not to regard it as a first step towards separation, but rather to ask the promoters in charge to formulate the guarantee they proposed to give for the supremacy of Parliament.
