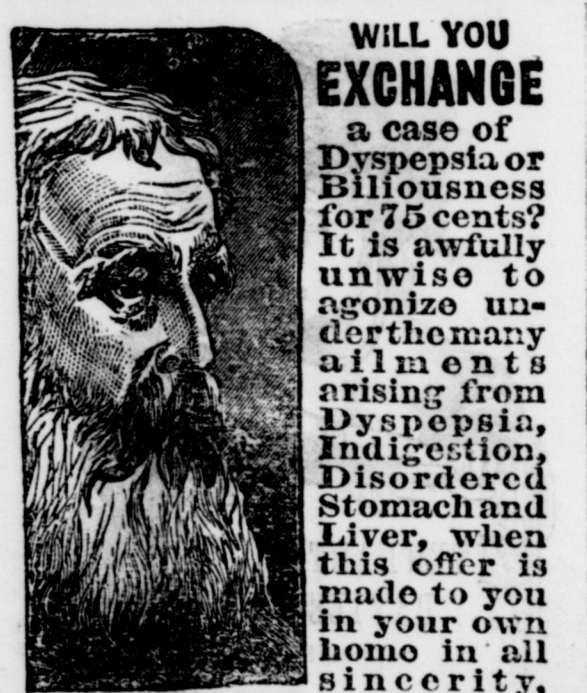
"Ah," says I, "you might speak to the watchman, if you see him, and tell him to keep an extra lookout to-night."

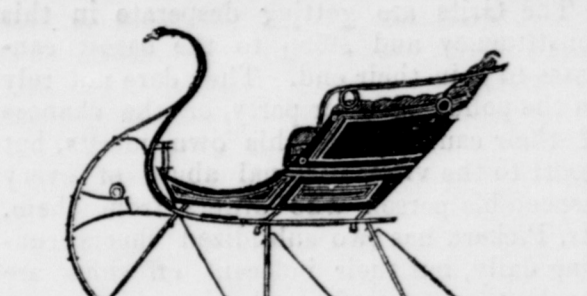

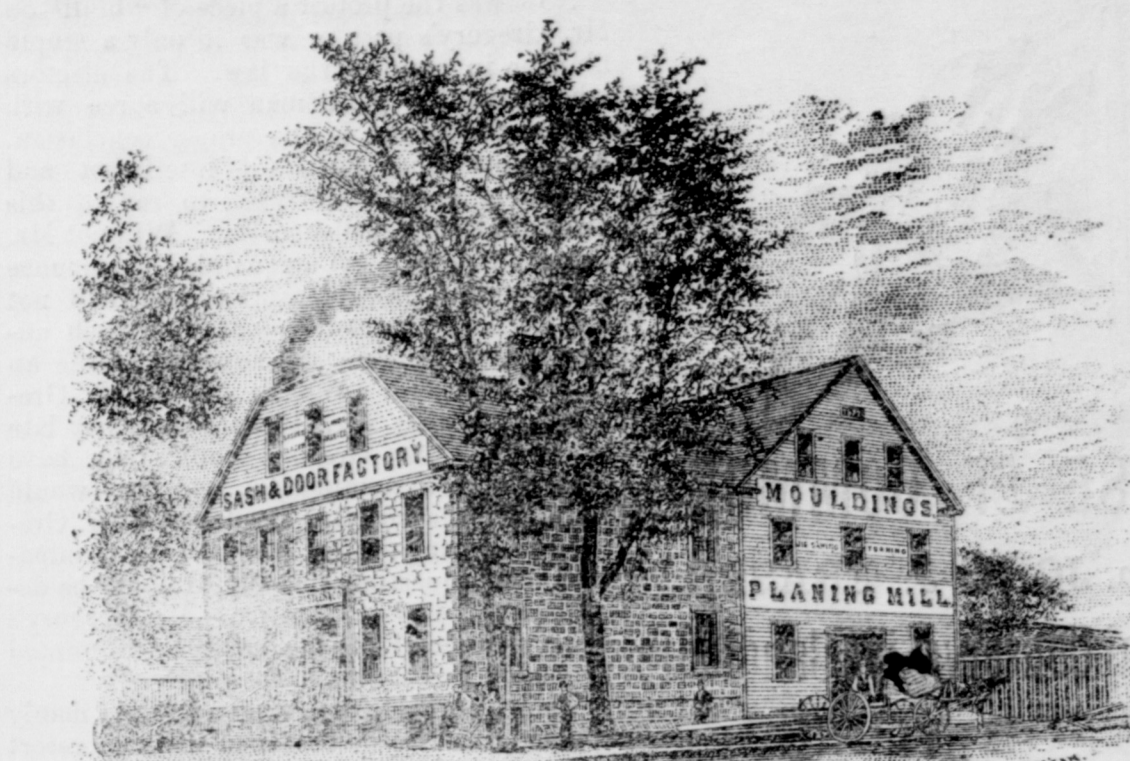
