Warren Smith, the Halifax carman, was lost in the recent gales on the Banks of Newfoundland. He left Halifax on a fishing schooner, on the 27th ult., with seven companions, and no tidings of them have since been heard. They were out only two days when the great storm arose.
The tea meeting at the Mouth of the Tay, New Brunswick, on Mr. Wm. McBean's grounds, Wednesday evening, was a success. The receipts netted \$175. The Fredericton Brass Band were in attendance, and pleasing addresses were delivered by Rev. J. S. Mallan and Mr. J. D. Hazen.
At the recent meeting of the St. John Presbytery the committee of visitation reported favorably in regard to the congregations at Stanley and Newmarket, and the Presbytery expressed approval at the display of spirit, progress and zeal in the recent session of the new church and manse.

The locomotive got by without touching her, but the end of the baggage car struck her in the face and she died from the effects of a few minutes after.

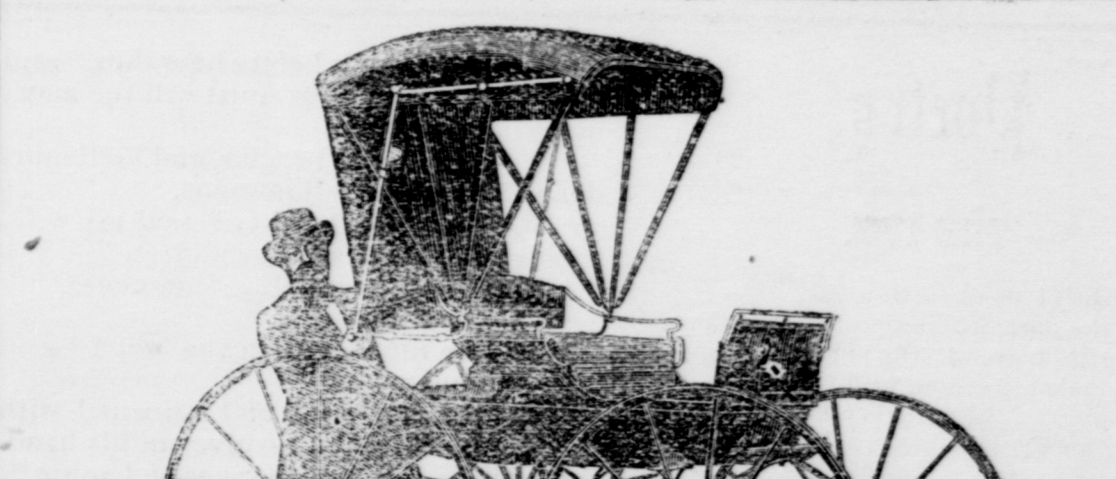
