The Dominion License Bill.

This measure, introduced by Sir John A. Macdonald on Saturday, provides among other things that each electoral district shall have a board of three commissioners, who shall grant all licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors, such commission in New Brunswick to consist of the County Court Judge of the district, the Mayor or Warden, and a third to be appointed by the Dominion Government.
