The election in the city of St. John yesterday, to fill the vacancy in the House of Commons, caused by Sir Leonard Tilley's resignation, resulted as we anticipated, in the return of Dr. Barker. His majority, however, is not nearly so large as Mr. Everett's was in the election a few weeks ago.

Mr. Everett led Mr. McCleod in the city, four hundred, while Dr. Barker's majority over Judge Skinner, is only one hundred and twelve. The difference is not due to any revulsion of feeling towards the Government, but is because of personal matters.
