Continental Broils.

The complications of Great Britain, France, Russia, Egypt, and China. A Collision of War Rumors.

The expenses of the Sudan campaign thus far amount to \$2,300,000. The Grenadier Guards and 400 Indian cavalry have arrived at Suakin.

Gen. Graham, in command of the Soudan expedition, started from Cairo on the 9th inst. for Lake Tana.

The Secretary of War announced that the Government intend to increase the strength of the army 20,000 men.

The Italian men-of-war Danubio and Conte Cavour, with six Italian iron-clad vessels, arrived at Port Said, on the 9th inst.

A Durban, Zululand, despatch says it is reported that a proposal has been made to organize 5,000 Zulus for service in the Soudan.

The Chinese Government is preparing to resume defensive operations against the French in Tonquin.

More concern is felt in England for the troops in Egypt, on account of the deadly nature of the few months of hot weather they will have to endure.

Lord Charles Bessford, with his naval brigade, has arrived at Korti. They are to be the first to be sent to the Soudan.

The destination of the fourth Italian expedition to the Red Sea, composed of four battalions of infantry and two companies of artillery and engineers is to be Trieste.

It is authoritatively stated that the convention between Italy and England relating to the Soudan gives Italy equal rights with England in Egypt, and allows Italy liberty of navigation.

All preparations for the transportation of the British troops to the Soudan, in the event of war, are rapidly maturing.

The Oxford Eighth Infantry at Madras has been ordered to Quetta.

General Digma has sent a letter to the British Government in command of the British troops in the Soudan, announcing that the fall of Kassala is imminent, and warning the English that they will be defeated and driven into the sea if they venture inside the city.

A despatch from Calcutta states that India is able and ready to concentrate 20,000 native troops under British Imperial colors at any time.

The Afghan frontier question is the principal topic of discussion in Calcutta, but no anxiety is expressed as to the result.

Gen. Wolsey has been advised to pass the summer at Cyprus for the benefit of his eyes. Military critics in London believe that this is the beginning and the end, and that the fall of Wolsey will come home on sick leave, and the full command of the Soudan expedition will be given to Gen. Sir Gerald Graham.

A "smokeless" powder has been at last adopted by the British War Department. It is a powder which is not only smokeless, but also non-toxic and non-damaging to the lungs.

The plan adopted for the defence of Suakin is as follows: The Indian garrison will camp on the right of the town, and the guards on the left, while a semi-circle of 180 yards from the inner line of defence, connecting with the latter. The water supply is abundant.

The London Times, in its leader on the 9th inst., upon the Afghan frontier dispute, says that the British Government is determined to defend Suakin at all costs.

Gen. Briere de la Riviere, commander of the French forces in Tonquin, telegraphed the office on the 9th inst., that his loss during the two days fighting to relieve a beleaguered French garrison was 98 killed and 133 wounded.

The London Times, of the 10th inst., says that the Russian Government has advanced further in Afghan territory, and is now in imminent danger of being cut off from Herat.

The English Government has definitely decided upon the construction of a pipeline from Suakin to Berber, similar to the one used in the oil regions in the United States.

Gen. Lord Wolsey, in his address to the British troops at Korti, on the 7th inst., used the following language: 'The Queen desires me to express her admiration of your courage and self-reliance. To have commanded such a body of men to do the highest and noblest of men to do no greater honor can be in store for you than that I look forward to of leading you to the relief of Suakin, and to the conquest of the Soudan.'
