One of the most eminent public men Nova Scotia has ever produced, is Sir Adams G. Archibald, whose name for the past thirty years, has been almost continuously connected with the politics of the country. For a long term of years, he represented Colchester in the Nova Scotia Assembly, and in the Government, and later in the House of Commons and the Dominion Cabinet He has served his country as governor of Manitoba, and afterwards for tw terms in the same capacity in his nativ province. For the past two years, how ever, Sir Adams has not been in public life, but at the Contervative gathering at Truro last week, addressed by Hon. Messrs. McLelan, Foster, White and Thompson, he occupied the chair, and introducing the Ministers, he gave some reminisences of his rule in Manitoba. will be remembered that when Sir Adams started out for Manitoba, Riel's first re bellion was at its height, but on hearing that the new Governor was accompanied by an armed force to put down the in surrection, Riel speedily made his escape from Fort Garry, and Governor Archi bald after a time was able to restore quiet to the country. It was more particularly to the eyents immediately following his arrival at Manitoba's capital, that Sir Adams spoke in Truro the other night, and his remarks on that occasion, placed Mr. Blake in a most dishonorable light as regards his connexion with Riel Governor Archibald, notwithstanding Riel himself was out of the way, found the people of Manitoba in a great state of excitement. The whole country was seething and boiling. The French had recently been triumphant. They had misused their power, and Riel had caused the death of poor Scott, and carried out the sentence of a sham court in a barbarous manner. Since that the English had got the upper hand,—the natural feeling was to repay the French in kind -and the moment Governor Archibald reached the country, he wes beset with delegations urging the most vindictive proceedings. On the other hand, the French were in dread of what might come upon them, and were ready for any excess, The new Governor acted as mediator between the two parties. The excited feeling calmed down, Riel was hiding, and it was then that Mr. Blake appeared on the scene. In the Ontario Assembly he moved a resolution offering \$5000 for Riel's capture, accompanying his motion with a speech, in which he denounced Riel as a monster of iniquity. The resolution carried, and the offer of the reward, coupled with Blake's fiery speech, set the half breeds of Manitoba against the Government. Civil war was averted only by the delicate and statesmanlike manner in which Governor Archibald performed his duties. But what did Mr. Blake care.
