Agriculture. Feeding Work Horses. According to the New York Star, the following is the method of feeding the horses of the Adams Express Co.

Feeding Grain. The fact that grain crops are mainly sold has left farmers no resource except to use straw and hay for food for stock, only substituting grain for animals fattening or for those at severe labor.

Chickens and Turkeys. If thoroughbred chickens are raised and it is desired to keep them pure blooded they should not be allowed to run with males of another breed after they are two months old of the small breeds, or three months old if of the larger and slow maturing breeds.

Consumption of Pork. The statistician of the Department of Agriculture for the United States writes: "We certainly eat more pork than England consumes of beef, after duplicating the allowance of that country in the British nation."

Rotation of Crops. This is one of the most important questions relating to farm work, and deserves especial consideration. The old practice was to follow grain with the grass crop or with one which required frequent cultivation of the soil.

Effects of Soil on Milk. Like every other product, animal or vegetable, the quality of milk depends on the soil on which it is raised. It will be more or less rich, as the soil is more or less rich.

In the report made up and concurred in by practical and scientific men, the quantities fixed upon as a minimum were: Working ox or mule, 2 oz.; oxen, fattening, 1 to 2 oz.; sheep (double for fattening), 1/2 to 1 oz.; horses and mules, 1 oz.
