English Affairs.

Mr. Gladstone, recognizing that a large majority of the new British Parliament, has been returned, opposed to his Home Rule scheme, has placed his resignation in the Queen's hands, and Lord Salisbury, the Conservative leader, has been called upon to form a new ministry. After receiving the summons, Salisbury's first act was to consult Lord Hartington, the leader of the dissenting Liberals, and to endeavor to induce him to enter the Cabinet. This Hartington emphatically declined, and the new formation will be entirely Tory, all hope of a coalition government having faded with Hartington's refusal.

Lord Salisbury is having much difficulty in constructing his cabinet. All that is yet known of its prospective personnel, is that he will retain for himself only the Premiership, and that Lord Randolph Churchill will be the leader of the Government in the Commons.

One of the strongest forces against which Mr. Gladstone had to contend during the recent electoral contest, was the great influence of John Bright who took a firm position against Home Rule. His letters and speeches were quoted all over the country, and with great effect against the Gladstonites. Since the campaign closed, a speech delivered by Bright at Dublin in 1866, favoring Home Rule, has been dug up, and it is being used to the discredit of the great Liberal, who among other things on that occasion is represented as having said that—

"The tenants in England and Scotland are much more powerful than the tenants here, because you are acting alone here, and are not a great and powerful body in London. If you had a parliament at College Green, clearly the tenantry of Ireland would, with the present feeling in Ireland, be able to force that parliament any measure of justice they named; but as you have to deal with a great parliament sitting in London, all you can do is to make a demand, and urge from this side of the channel come with very feeble effect, especially as you can only be represented by about a hundred members, and of those, unfortunately, it happens that a considerable number are unwilling to support the demands made. It is one of the most difficult things in the world for fifty men among six hundred, some hundred miles from those they represent, to work up any question which may be against the prejudices and sympathies of the six hundred."

The result of the Dilke-Crawford trial has turned attention from political matters. Dilke has paid very dearly for reopening the scandal against him. The British public have no alternative after the disclosures of the trial, but to believe Dilke guilty of all the charges preferred in connexion with Mrs. Crawford. So thoroughly was the Court and jury impressed with the truth of the charges that they have granted Mr. Crawford an absolute divorce. The verdict has ruined Dilke, socially and politically. He is obliged to give up all idea of re-entering public life, and will leave the country. His fall is one of the greatest sensations of the age. Next to Gladstone he was the greatest of the Liberal party, and was regarded as the probable successor to Gladstone in the leadership at no distant day. Less than three weeks ago he was defeated in Chelsea for Parliament, by only a small majority, and although defeated, a sympathetic demonstration in his behalf followed the declaration of the poll. The vote of his Chelsea constituency, however, would not have sounded the close of Dilke's political career, but that it was followed so closely by the verdict of the court, in which the brazen-faced Mrs. Crawford disclosed the rottenness of Sir Charles's social life, and her own shame.

Hon. James Service, ex-Premier of Victoria, Australia, was in New York the other day, on his way to England, in conversation with a Mail reporter said that, "some years ago Victoria declared for protection. I am opposed to protection, but I must confess it has worked admirably. Our colony has grown prosperous and manufactures have sprung up all over the country. We have a revenue from duties to carry on the Government, and are far in advance of our sister colonies. The price of living is higher, but skilled labor has been greatly benefited. I cannot say as much for the unskilled laborer. His wages have not advanced and he is in a worse condition. It is true we are all beginning to suffer somewhat like the United States from overproduction. New South Wales and South Australia are seriously thinking of declaring for protection. They have watched Victoria's prosperity, and wish to profit by our example."

Basbful politicians are a rarity in our country, but one has just been discovered in Kentucky. He was being married, and his best man was also a politician. Several prominent Canadians visiting England, had a narrow escape from death by a railway accident last Friday. A special train conveying them from London to Portsmouth, to witness the naval review, was derailed and twelve of the passengers received serious injuries, among the number being Sir William Dawson, President of McGill University, Montreal, and Lady Dawson.

The Quebec Elections.
The local elections in the Province of Quebec are to come off in September, and the politicians are already actively at work. A great effort is being made by the Grit party under the local leader, Honore Mercier and the Dominion leader Laurier, to oust the Conservative administration led by Dr. Ross, but the local issues are being lost sight of almost entirely. The battle is over the corpse and the memory of Louis Riel, Mercier and his friends holding up the dead murderer as a martyr to the French cause. The Conservatives, on the other hand, are conducting the campaign on the issues involved in the administration of the public affairs of the Province. The Grit nationalist rebellion party are appealing to race and religious prejudices. The Conservatives rely on the excellent record Dr. Ross' Government has made during the past four years. The whole burden of the Grit slogan in fact, is of Riel. The following quotations from the report of one of their recent public meetings, will give some idea of the manner in which they are conducting the campaign—

"The first speaker was Senator Belloc. He spoke of the franchise act, and said that in a few years, when a few millions of immigrants had come, the French vote would be overwhelming. He then blamed the government for the Riel execution. He did not blame Mr. Olinette; he knew he had been misled like everybody else. He then blamed the government for the Riel execution and said that he did not sympathize with the execution of Riel. Mr. George Duhamel, C. Q., spoke next and asked the electors to vote against the federal government which so grossly insulted their race. Mr. O. David spoke also on the Riel question, saying that if they did not profit by this occasion to overthrow Sir John and his government his next step would be to abolish and annihilate the language of their fathers, and to speak in English. He concluded by saying something as follows: He concluded by saying that it was for them to show the Orangemen of Ontario that they were mistaken if they thought French-Canadians were a race to be led by the nose. Mr. Bergeron said that by their position now, the national party would show the Orangemen of Ontario that they were not to be insulted. Their punishment, he hoped, would be the result of the next election."

It seems to be the same with the Grit party everywhere. They have no policy of their own, but they seek to win by introducing side issues, a true evidence of demagogism. In Nova Scotia it is demagogism; in Quebec it is sympathy with rebellion and murder. Anything and everything to get back into power. The party has no claim on its own merits; in the Quebec election it seeks to manipulate the Riel scaffold, and its efforts there are very materially strengthened by the course Mr. Blake took in the Commons in sympathy with the arch rebel, and which our own Mr. Weldon saw fit to follow.

Sir John Macdonald and party reached Victoria, British Columbia Saturday. Addresses of welcome were presented at Port Moody and at Vancouver. At the wharf at Victoria, a large throng welcomed Sir John, and a torchlight procession and band escorted the party to the Driard hotel. Many senators and members and officials were there to receive the premier. A banquet, ball, and regatta are spoken of among the festivities in his honor. Sir John's health has greatly improved since he left Ottawa. He will remain at Victoria a couple of weeks, and there will be a succession of festivities.

An unusual event took place during the voting at Farwell, in the British Columbian elections, illustrative of the free and easy way they conduct affairs in the untrammelled West. The contest in the district was between Baker, the Government candidate, who, like the majority of his colleagues, was successful, and Brown. There were on the list just seventy-five voters, two of whom were held in durance vile in the local prison, for imbibing too freely of Pacific coast liquor, and these were duly brought to the polls by the accommodating jailer and cast their ballots for the Liberal standard bearer.

An enterprising St. John gentleman, Mr. A. B. Sheraton, has given Halifax hotel, fitted up with all the modern conveniences. Mr. Sheraton leased the old International Hotel, and has thoroughly remodelled it. The Herald describes the "Queen" which Mr. Sheraton has rechristened the house, "a credit to Halifax." Mr. Sheraton deserves, and will not doubt receive all the reward his great enterprise deserves. Fredericton people visiting Halifax will always receive a most cordial welcome, and the most kindly attention from Mr. Sheraton.

The Dominion Ministers from the Lower Provinces are enjoying an outing among their constituents and friends. Hon. Mr. Foster, Minister of Marine has just completed a visit around the coast of New Brunswick. Hon. Mr. Costigan, Minister of Inland Revenue, passed through here today, to Grand Falls. Hon. Mr. McLellan, Finance Minister, is enjoying himself in Colchester, and Hon. Mr. Thompson, Minister of Justice, is visiting Antigonish.

The authorities in a Mexican city recently arrested an American editor on a trivial charge. The United States demanded his release, but up to the present time he is still in prison, and there is likely to be trouble over the affair. The Mexicans are very defiant and talk war, but diplomacy will likely avert a collision.

Hon. Peter Mitchell on returning to Montreal from his visit to Northumberland, told a Star reporter that the people in his county were all loyal to confederation. Fire swept away \$4,000,000 worth of property in the United States and Canada, during the first six months of the present year.

British Columbia's Defences.
The Minister of Militia visits England in connection therewith.
Sir Adolphus Caron, Minister of Militia, left for England last week in the steamer Vancouver. He will be absent about six weeks, during which time he will visit the various forts and military installations in the British Isles. It is not unlikely that the proposed fortifications to be erected in British Columbia will occupy much of his attention, though the minister for pleasure, on the present occasion, than for business. Great activity is going on, just now, at the Pacific coast. Lt. Col. O'Brien and three non-commissioned officers of the Royal Engineers are on their way to Esquimaux and other points. They are going to survey Victoria harbor and district, in order to select proper places for the erection of the forts which are to be used as naval stations and military depots for Imperial troops. Already, several surveys and propositions have been made. The engineers intend making preliminary surveys, and they will, later on, report the result of their labors. Part of their duty will be to select sites for the forts, and to make plans for their construction. Work will be pushed as rapidly as possible, the completion of the Canadian Pacific Railway has made the Imperial authorities aware of the value of British Columbia to them as a military and naval point.
