Cut worms or larvæ of several species of insects are often very troublesome when cabbage plants are first set out. these creatures to their death, and it can be done every time. In these the leaves are dipped and then distributed

over the ground. The cabbage worm, the common green worm that feeds on the leaves of the growing plants, can be easily destroyed, and at little cost by the use of Persian Insect Powder. The cabbage fly which deposits its eggs on the stems of the young cabbage plants, is often very troublesome. The maggots, when hatched out, work into here and there through the field, unprotected, in order that the flies may visit them and lay their eggs. These plants the flies will seek out and leave the others untouched. The plants that have been visited will soon show the effects of the insects, and can then be pulled up and burned.






