Fredericton Curling Club.

The recent session of York district lodge, I. O. G. T., held at the mouth of the Kennebec with Vesuvius lodge, was by far the best held by that lodge. Fire was discovered in the county court house shortly after noon Monday, it having originated in the ceiling from the furnace pipe leading from Registrar Yerris's office to the court room above. The fire burned through the floor and ran along the joists before it was discovered, and the firemen had some difficulty in getting at it. However the damage will not exceed \$150. Mr. Bairdford, clerk of the peace, who has his office on the ground floor next to the record office, saved all his papers and there was no damage to the records, the solid brick wall being in putting out the fire. Very little damage was done to the building by water. Two accidents from contact with electric light apparatus occurred Monday evening. At the Gas Company's station Capt. Lyons and one of his hands badly burned and narrowly escaped instant death. In front of Stuart's jeweller's store the rain having filled the insulation tubes, which run into the electric light cut-off with water, the current was thus conducted to the wood-work and set it on fire. In order to prevent any further damage, the current had to be shut off at the station, and all the lights of the houses were extinguished for over an hour.
