A Representative Delegation

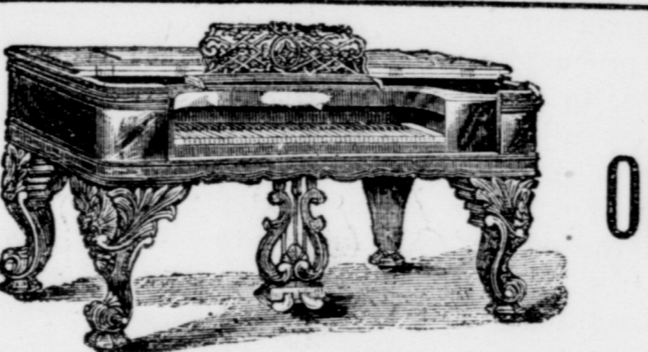
