The Roads and Streets. During the late heavy rains, the roads in the city, and the conduct of road committee have come in for some mild critism in one of our newspapers. Some people are apt to find fault without being thoroughly informed concerning the subject matter of their complaints, and without even taking any pains to so inform themselves. In the present instance, we are satisfied that a careful investigation of road matters will lead any fair minded person to the conclusion that the roads and streets committee are entitled to praise, and not to blame at the hands of their constituents. Or the 31st of October, 1887, the road department had overdrawn its account to the extent of \$930, and from that date up to the time the present committee took charge, a further large sum was expended for snow ploughing, keeping the back roads open during the winter, and for other purposes. The present committee decided to keep the expenditure for the present year s rictly within their income, and the result has been, that on the 31st of October, 1888, the road account was only over drawn \$50, and it would have been in credit but for the fact that the local representatives did not, before that date, reimburse the committee for a necessary expenditure on the Brick Kill road which they promised to do, and which the committee fully and reasonably expected would be placed to their credit before the end of the fiscal year just closed. We are sure that this action on the par and it leaves the road account at the end of the fiscal year in a better posi tion than it has been for a long time. After these old balances had been wiped out, there was not enough money left on hand to rebuild any of the streets completely, and the chairman of the committee, who has given a great deal of his time to the interests of the city during his term of office, decided that it would be wiser to make repairs only to Queen street available, there being no old debts to pay off, would be in a position to have for the next four years. it put in thorough condition. The use of Grand Lake gravel has not given the satisfaction that was ex pected, but one of the main difficulties which meets every road committee is the obtaining of proper material for the making of roads. The stone used in the past for macadamizing has been generally condemned, as it is of too soft and friable a character and too quickly, with heavy traffic over it, such as that on Queen street, grinds into powder. Many people during several years past have complained of the Council continuing to use broken stone, and up to this season there was a feeling shared in by very many that the use of gravel would give much better results. For some time after it was put on York and Queen streets this impression seemed to be confirmed, and the gravel gave every satisfaction, but the late heavy rains have demonstrated the fact that it is not altogether suitable for the purpose. It is only fair, however, to have in mind that the season has been an unusually wet one, and it is not in Fredericton alone that the people are complaining of the condition of the roads and streets.
