




It is to be boped that you did not feed high during the winter; but if you commence to feed liberally four weeks before the lambing season, you do just what is right. Let your ewes have all the liberty they want-going in and comand tails. Let no dampness in their beds exist. Specially observe that there is no odor of ammonia escaping from the manure.
