The Age of a Horse. It is not an easy matter to tell the age of a horse, though many claim to do so.

How to Secure a Fast Walker. Recognizing the fact that the fast walker is always desirable, and more valuable than any other, the question is how to secure this trait in all the colts.

Weed the Stock. Weed out the stock with a rigid hand. There are altogether too many inferior animals found among the herds and flocks of the common farmer.
