BROOKLYN THEATRE.—The owners of the Brooklyn Theatre have decided not to rebuild. The property will remain idle until spring, when the proprietors of the Brooklyn Eagle Newspaper Company will probably erect a building.

SEASONABLE.—Messrs. Everett & Butler's Holiday card, sent to their correspondents in different parts of the Province was a very neat affair and an evidence of the firm's regard for their friends. We wish them many happy and prosperous returns of the season.

OREGON SALMON.—During the recent salmon-fishing season in Oregon, the eighteen "canneries" on the Lower Columbia River have put up 428,730 cases. Of these over 400,000 cases contained four dozen one pound tins. Over 100,000 cases have been shipped direct to England.

A SAD INCIDENT.—Here is a story of suffering in New York:—Julia Deems, No. 68 Cherry street, was found sitting on the curb-stones in Frankfort street, shivering with cold and moaning over a bundle in her arms. In the bundle the policeman found an infant, frozen to death. The wretched woman is the wife of a drunkard, whose cruelty drove her into the streets to beg. She was unable either to feed or warm her child, and the baby died of cold on its mother's breast.

GOLDEN WEDDING.—Yesterday was the fifteenth anniversary of the marriage of Alex. Marshall, Esq., of Chatham, and there was quite a pleasant family gathering at his residence, Clifton Place, corner of Henderson and Church Streets.—Among those present were Robert Marshall, Esq., M. P., W. Whitaker, Wm. Sadler and other relatives and their families. Mr. and Mrs. Marshall were presented with a package of gold—a most appropriate gift—the sum being quite a handsome one. The recipients are aged, respectively, 72 and 68 years and look as if they might yet have a diamond wedding anniversary. We hope they may.

ACCIDENTALLY SHOT.—Mary Jane, aged about sixteen years, daughter of Daniel Conroy, Rayside, parish of St. Croix, Charlotte Co., was shot in the thigh, on Thursday last and dangerously, if not fatally wounded. Her brother was fixing the lock of the gun, in which there was at the time a heavy charge of duck shot. She was standing near him, at the store, the hammer fell and discharged the gun. The shot carried off the ends of her fingers and lodged in her thigh, below the groin, making a fearfully lacerated wound. Dr. Riess of St. Stephen was sent for, but we are informed was unable to stop the flow of blood, and gave no hope of her recovery.

COLONIAL TERRITORY.—From the annual statistical abstracts for British India and the colonies, it appears that the total area of the possessions approaches 7,900,000 square miles. British India is described as having an area of 897,004 square miles, with a population of 189,613,138 (the Colonial value put at 190,663,923 in 1871.) and 37,041,239 inhabited houses. The area of the Native States is estimated at 589,315 square miles, with a population of 50,325,457 souls, bringing the area up to 1,486,319 square miles with 239,938,000 persons living upon it. The Dominion of Canada figures for nearly three million and a half square miles, and Australia for slightly over three million square miles.

JACK AS GOOD AS HIS MASTER.—A Columbia, S. C. special says. Wade Hampton sent the following to Governor Chamberlain yesterday:—"Sir, Having been legally elected and duly inaugurated Governor of South Carolina, I call upon you to deliver forthwith, into my possession, the great seal of the State, the State house offices, appointments, &c." To which Chamberlain replied as follows:—"Your note, demanding the seal of the State, offices, appointments, &c., received. I give the legally elected and duly qualified Governor of this State, I see no reason why your demand should be complied with."

REMYT LOSS.—The Mail's Montreal correspondent telegraphs on 18th that Alexander Nadeau, a farmer belonging to Seely's Bay, Ont., while crossing the ice opposite Longue Point on the previous Saturday with his team valued at \$150, his horses went through followed by a pony tied to the sleigh, and had it not been for the opportune arrival of two men his own life would have been lost. As it was he received some slight injuries. He had in his sleigh a value containing \$300, the proceeds of a little property which had been left him recently, and from the sale of which he was returning. He also reports that ten milk cows and fifty sheep belonging to parties whose names he could not ascertain were lost about the same time.

PERSONAL.—Hon. Peter Mitchell is in town, and is looking well. If one may judge by the hand-shaking which has passed between the hon. gentleman and his friends since his arrival here, we might justly have strong suspicions that Mr. Mitchell has some designs on this constituency. Mr. McDougall will be brought back to look after him.—St. John Globe.

Robert Marshall, Esq., M. P., is in town. We are very sorry to learn that Rev. J. V. Nugent of Tracadie was lying dangerously ill at latest advices from that Parish.

HARD UP FOR A GRIEVANCE.—The Moncton Times ascertained that a train had been run faster than pleased Mr. Donville, M. P.—and the rate must, therefore, have been something fearful—and in the course of a homily on the question of fast trains and their dangers says:—"A fact worthy of note in this connection is that the superintendent was on board, which shows either that the drivers have very little respect for his authority or that he has never cautioned them against too rapid running, notwithstanding the repeated warnings which have been given. We are told that Mr. Donville, M. P., remonstrated with Mr. Lattrell and got laughed at for his pains!"

The Telegraph referring to the above says:—"We believe that Mr. Lattrell was not on board the train when the fast time was complained of. When he joined the train and met Mr. Donville, Mr. Lattrell understood that Mr. Donville's complaint of speed, directed to be decreased and subsequently it did not exceed that prescribed in the time table. We are informed that Mr. Donville has not laughed at Mr. Donville, though we have not had an opportunity of seeing the latter gentleman since his journey. We have no doubt, however, that Mr. Lattrell has quite too much respect for Mr. Donville or for any gentleman in his position to laugh at any suggestion he would make in regard to the rate of speed on the train."

The Times ought to be more just to Mr. Lattrell and avoid pursuing him with vindictive misrepresentation. It is quite probable that he is not perfection itself, but no paper has a right to publish falsehoods about a public servant. It is carrying the liberty of the press to an extent that ought to secure a tweaked nose to the publisher—that is if the aggrieved party is not one of the "turn the other cheek" kind of Christians.

THE BOAT SUNK.—Last Wednesday night the tug boat Lottie, owned by Jas. Neilson, Esq., was jammed by ice against the wharf at which she was lying in the upper part of the town, and having caught under the end of a projecting log, was careened over by the rising tide which filled and sank her. The owner and Capt. Dudley Wells, assisted by a gang of men set to work with a will, and by the aid of tackle attached to the wharf and the schr. Daddy raised the tug on Monday night, after which they procured the steam fire engine and pumped her out. The mishap was a somewhat expensive one but we are glad that it did not turn out quite so bad as it was at first thought to be.

Our esteemed contemporary ought to let our readers alone and not make a bankrupt case an occasion for mention in the fact that the bankrupt mentioned in the ADVANCE. It is only within a month or two that the firm mentioned patronized this paper, so its business misfortune may be due to the fact that it did not advertise with us earlier. With reference to the "eight" advertisements of Messrs. Hilyard & Armstrong referred to so uncharitably by the Advance, we will take the trouble to explain that, like other firms on the Miramichi, in St. John and elsewhere they had a yearly contract with us for a certain amount of space, with the privilege of having changes made at stated periods.

Each of the eight advertisements was so small that when measured altogether they only filled the space contracted for, a phrase of advertising business which our contemporary ought to understand. Messrs. Hilyard & Armstrong will, we hope, come through their business difficulties in such a way as to enable them to go on again as others in their circumstances have done before him. Business misfortunes ending in bankruptcy should never, above all other things, be used by our contemporary as a weapon against the Advertiser, simply because he has advertised the business of persons who, through mishap, failed to pay their creditors in full. We have not taken advantage of such misfortunes as against the Advertiser, when we might have done so without going so far as St. John to look for the subjects, and we thought our contemporary would say us in that as it has in many other things which have gained it any little credit it now possesses. We hope that the influences of the present hallowed season will impart to it more of that spirit of charity of which it seems in so much need at present, and if it cannot remember and act upon the Golden Rule it will, at least not forget the proverb which contains a reference to the foolishness of throwing stones under certain circumstances.

MAIL MISSED.—For the third or fourth time within six months the ADVANCE was made to miss the train last Wednesday night, owing to the tardiness of the person engaged to take the baggage from this office to the station. On former occasions regular trains were missed, but last Wednesday evening the train left the station at eleven p. m., instead of forty minutes after that time and although we sent information of the change to the driver he reached the station too late. We have made no arrangements for the service indicated and hope that neither our friends is nor will be so disappointed again.

THE NEW METHODIST CHURCH.—Messrs. McKean & Fairweather of this city, are engaged on plans for the new Methodist Church, Chatham. The site on which it is to stand is on Henderson St., just above the residence of Alex. Marshall, Esq., and was purchased from Hon. Wm. Muirhead for \$400. The new edifice will be built of brick, and will be placed on a lot of 30 x 100 ft. in the tower. He offers to furnish \$2,000 for every \$1,000 raised by the rest of the congregation.

THE ABOVE, we believe, correct with this exception that Hon. Mr. Muirhead offered to give a piece of land of 73 feet front and having a depth of 120 feet, but he wanted \$400 for an additional strip 60 ft. wide and 120 ft. deep necessary to give the Trustees of the Church a lot of the size they required. They offered him \$400 for the whole, but he adhered to his original idea of making a gift of a part of the lot and requiring his price for the balance.

THE CHURCH DECORATIONS AND SERVICES.—The holidays have brought with them the usual signs of the season, among the most pleasing being the decorations in those churches which make Christmas one of the greatest of their festivals.

In St. Mary's Chapel the decorations are, tastefully arranged; the moldings around the triple east window are entwined with evergreen wreaths, supporting the following Texts in white frosted letters on a scarlet ground:—"Holy, Holy, Holy; Lord God of Hosts; Emmanuel; In the wall above the window, is the Text "Glory to the New Born King," in white letters on a scarlet ground. Above the latter text is a crown in white and scarlet ground. The eastern wall is further decorated with evergreen festoons and garlands of Texts, Wonderful! Counselor; Mighty God, Messiah; Side windows are wreathed with evergreen, and between them on the walls are the Texts in white and scarlet, Emmanuel, God with us; Son of God; Son of Man; Peace on earth; Good will to men. Underneath those Texts are devices in evergreen, scarlet and white, representing the Eternity and Unity of the Trinity. On the gallery front are the Texts King of Kings; Lord of Lords, and devils bearing the words Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts; and the monogram I. H. S. Also above and below these are wreaths of evergreen. The organ is decorated with evergreen and nutmeg leaves. The service on Christmas day was at 11 o'clock. It was well attended and hearty, and consisted of morning Prayer, Holy Communion, and sermon, by the Rector. A Christmas Carol was heartily sung by the Sunday School children before the service. The music by the choir consisted of Jackson's Te Deum, and jubilate and other appropriate pieces. The sermon was from the text, Glory to God in the Highest, etc., and the collection was for the poor.

In St. Paul's Parish Church the decorations are very simple but tasteful. The moldings of the east window are entwined with evergreen, and on the eastern wall is the Text, We have seen his Star in the East and are come to Worship Him. The Prayer Desk, Pulpit and Font are very neatly trimmed with evergreen and scarlet. The service in this church was at 3 o'clock, and consisted of evening prayer, and sermon by Rev. Mr. Barber of Newcastle. The offerings for the sick and needy amounted to \$20.

The usual Christmas decorations of St. Michael's Cathedral have been neglected this year, owing to the press of more important work, although the usual representation of the crib occupies its accustomed position. It is tastefully draped in white, the drapery being caught here and there with bunches of artificial flowers, the whole presenting a very pleasing appearance. Low Mass was held on Christmas Day at 5 a. m. at 9.30 a. m. and Pontifical High Mass at 10.30 a. m. at which an impressive sermon was preached from the text, "Glory to God in the highest" by his Lordship Bishop Rogers. Other services were also held during the day. The contributions towards the fund for the Bishop and other clergy amounted to about \$400.

RAILWAY COLLISION.—On Tuesday there was a train collision at Bartlogue caused by the express from the north running into that from the north while the latter was waiting to be crossed on the main line. The following are the Globe's dispatches in reference to the matter:—

MONCTON, Dec. 26.—The Express train from the North was run into at Bartlogue station this morning by the Express train from Moncton. Driver Davis of up-train stopped near the switch to get up steam, and then started ahead and ran into the other train. He states that he mistook the distance between his train and the other train, and though he reversed his engine, he could not stop in time. Not very much damage done. The down train was waiting at the station.

ANOTHER ACCIDENT.—NEWCASTLE, Dec. 26.—The Express train coming South while waiting at Bartlogue main line was run into by the express train going North at two o'clock this morning. The trains were to cross at that Station. Both the locomotives and tenders were disabled. Locomotives were dispatched from Campbellton and Newcastle to take along the two trains. No one was injured. The trains were delayed about two hours.

FATAL TIGER HUNTING.—One of the most gallant English officers in India, Capt. Boydell, was recently killed by a tiger, near Sim, the summer retreat of the Viceroy. The tiger, after killing several animals crept away to a neighboring wood, whither the Captain accompanied by one native followed him. He overtook him by a brook, just at nightfall, as he was about devouring a dead horse.

Both fell at once, and the tiger fell, as though lifeless in the brook. The Captain, who thought he was dead, approached and touched him with his gun. Suddenly the tiger rose up on his hind legs, growling and opening his jaws, and, seizing the Captain by the throat and shoulders, tore a great piece of flesh from his body. The native, who meantime had reloaded, fired again; and the beast received his death wound; but in his dying struggle he crushed the legs of Capt. Boydell with his teeth, and, when the Hindoo lifted up his master, he found him dead.
